## WOULD NOT SELL WATER OUTSIDE RAILROAD WILL NOT HELP ARMY

The city shouldn't sell water to the Highlands district, north of Seattle, because such extension operates against values within the city limits, C. L. Irman, R. H. Thomson of the utilities committee told petitioners Thursday.

"The real estate men advertise 'All improvements and no city taxes,' and then want us to give them the benefit of our water plant," he said. "The Chamber of Commerce will come along and ask us to annex the property to gain 10 names to the population, and then register a kick against the cost of sweeping the streets."

Thomson said he would oppose the extension, no matter how much surplus water the city might have. Dale opposed him.

COLUMBUS, N. M., March 30.—Columbus will continue to be the main American supply base, in spite of Mexican railway privileges which have been granted, the belief of military men today. They pointed out that the roadbeds of Mexican lines needed many repairs before they would be of much use.

It is not believed Carranza will permit Americans to repair them.

Heavy supplies continue to be unloaded here. It is computed that 10,000 men now are searching for Villa.

The master awarded the Renton line \$11,700 against the city for damages in tearing up tracks in the Rainier ave. improvement. Receivers Calhoun and Parkin appealed, but Judge Cushman sustained the award.

## HOTEL GUESTS USE LOTS OF WATER NOW

## PLAN NEW SHIPYARD ARMY INCREASE IS UP

Lumber carrying schooners, equipped with internal combustion auxiliary engines, will be built in a new shipyard to be established in Seattle.

The concern will be headed by Naval Architect H. P. Spear of Philadelphia, who was government inspector during the construction of the battleship Nebraska in Seattle.

The yard expects to meet the demand for vessels for overseas lumber carriers.

Interested in the firm are Judges Turner and Flewelling of Spokane and William Pigott of Seattle.
