CARSTENS DIES OF PARALYSIS

President of German-American Bank Stricken Second Time

WELL KNOWN CITIZEN

Paralysis caused the death of Ernest Carstens, president of the German-American Mercantile bank of Seattle, Sunday, in Minor hospital.

He was one of the most widely known citizens of German birth in Seattle, and was one of the founders of the Carstens Packing Co. of Tacoma.

He was 45 years old. He had suffered a stroke of paralysis two weeks ago. Another Sunday evening caused his death.

Ernest Carstens was educated in Germany and landed in the United States with \$10.

With his brother, Thomas, he came to the Northwest and worked for Seattle packers. Later they started a butcher shop and finally went into the packing business.

The Carstens Packing Co. now sends meat to all parts of the world.

He has been vice president of the Commercial Club, president of the Seattle Turn Verein, and president of the German-American Mercantile bank.

He leaves a widow, his father, a brother and a sister, and an adopted daughter.

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OPPOSE EFFORT TO RAISE FARES

Labor Council and Commercial Club to Fight Tacoma Increase

HEARING ON TUESDAY

No stone will be left unturned by the Central Labor Council and the Commercial Club transportation bureau to thwart the efforts of the Puget Sound Navigation Co. to raise its boat fares between Seattle and Tacoma when the matter comes up for hearing Tuesday before the public service commission.

The hearing will be held at the Seattle Chamber of Commerce instead of at Tacoma, as announced Saturday, and will open at 10 o'clock.

Secretary James A. Duncan, of the labor council, in a recent letter to Chairman Charles A. Reynolds, of the public service commission, said the council had reason to believe the navigation company was overcapitalized and was using its receipts in a wasteful manner.

Duncan says he will ask permission to submit evidence to prove these statements and to show that if the receipts were turned into legitimate channels there would be ample funds to meet all operating expenses and provide a fair profit on the money invested.

He says he has the assurance of Chairman Reynolds that if the case is not decided against the company after the latter's evidence is all in, an opportunity will be given the labor men to present their side, even if a continuance is necessary.

Hamilton Higday, chairman of the Commercial Club transportation bureau, will represent that body at the hearing.

authority. I regard the securing of a clear, clean-cut, definite understanding on this matter as one of the most important matters before this council, as it will affect many of the major problems now before us.

SWITCHING IMPORTANT If the power, right and authority so to do, still remains with the city, one of the other important matters to be settled is, the control and charges for switching to all of the various wharves and sidings within the city and the necessary extension of tracks to new business territories about to be opened.

The business of the city council, so far as it has the authority, is to use every possible effort to secure for each such business site, or possible business site, the most perfect access to and communication with all the railroads entering the city, and without any duplication of lines. This is a matter requiring pro-

same extent as the water system is a water monopoly, thus avoiding the duplication of all distribution facilities, such as now exist?

This is a matter of policy which ought to be determined by this council, so that future construction can be carried on with a definite end in view.

SERVICE CURTAILED

There is, at the present time, very considerable conflict between the city and the street car company with reference to a number of matters which ought to be taken up and discussed in all fairness, and determination made as to the rights of each party, to the end that the very best service may be had by the public.

WILL SEAL DAM

Considerable importance has been attached to the fact that the north bank of the Cedar river basin for some distance above the new dam, is composed of somewhat porous material, so that it does not satisfactorily retain the waters of the lake when they are turned into this extension of the lake.

PROTECT CITY SERVANTS

There is a matter now before the council in which I am personally very greatly interested, and it has long been upon my heart, and that is the devising of some means by which there may

be secured for all of those who have been faithful servants of the city an assurance that when they shall have become incapacitated by old age, they shall receive an annuity which will permit them to spend their declining years in reasonable comfort.

MUST FIX COURSE

Above and beyond all of these things which I have mentioned, important to them he, is the responsibility upon this council to so conduct itself as to inspire confidence in the city on the part of would-be investors, to so cooperate with all parties that persons desiring to locate and build factories here may know that they can depend upon a fixed course of action by the council to secure them from expensive taxes and guarantee them against impositions of any kind.

NEED "GOOD HUMOR"

It is our business to use every effort to raise public confidence and to promote the harmony of the people. In doing this we will, ourselves, have to exercise good-will and good humor. We realize that we will be met

by persons who differ from us radically in their views, and who, altho they may not be able to agree with us in our views, are, nevertheless, as honest as we are in their purposes and in their beliefs, and that they are therefore entitled to the same courtesy and attention that we believe ourselves to be entitled to, and if we will meet the public in that spirit, and the public will meet us in that spirit, I see no reason why we can not get along together harmoniously and accomplish great good for the city.


TO SETTLE CLAIMS
