TELLS SIDE OF MANUFACTURER Industries, Nutter Declares GIVES TALK AT CLUB Seattle is deficient in the encouragement of manufacturers. Railroad regulation is a federal, not a state, question. The interstate commerce commission is hampered by the law forbidding it to raise rates as fast as reduce them. Seattle's fight for removal of the differential rate on tourist fares to the Coast is hampered because it is not presented directly to the interstate commerce commission. One of the chief problems of preparedness is adequate railroad transportation facilities. These are a few of the ideas expressed by L. A. Nutter, manager of the Western Wheeled Steamer Co., in an address before the Commercial Club Monday. "About a month ago," he said, "a million dollar ship-building concern, a member of the Seattle Commercial Club, was forced to go to Astoria, Ore., to locate instead of Seattle. "I can remember when Henry Ford went to Kansas City with \$100 in his pocket. "He asked Kansas City to help him start an automobile industry there, but they laughed at him, so Ford went to Detroit and took with him the entire automobile interest which afterwards made Detroit famous. "The same things are occurring here in Seattle every day. There should be an industrial map published, showing the location of available factory sites, and fabulous prices should not be charged for that real estate."
