SOCIALIST MAKERS OF PLATFORM WILL JEER PREPAREDNESS

(This is the last of four articles in which this noted political writer tells what the party platform will be like in the coming election.)

The socialists will be the last to enter the platform competition this year.

There is the only party that will not hold a convention.

Their national executive committee is charged with the duty of hammering out a platform, but when this is done it will have to take its chances in a party referendum and be subject to changes on a party vote.

So it will not be completed and put on view until August, or perhaps September.

Anybody can guess about the socialist platform, but nobody can get any good, first-class dope about it as he can about the others.

The socialists don't have any leaders or wise guys on the inside of things.

One of them knows about as much as another of what is going to be done.

But if there is anything that is a safe bet, it is that the socialist platform will have a big, resounding heil on war, get a cent out of the war, or say that in the United States war is possible. All these will be done to a frazzle.

Then, it is likely, there will be set forth the terms upon which the

suffering world is to be restored to peace.

No indemnities, no changes in geography except on a referendum of the people in a conquered province, all other boundaries to be as they were July 27, 1914. Great waterways, like the Suez and Panama canals, to be made international, and the fighting nations to be compelled to quit once.

Preparedness will probably have a great deal of attention, and the plank on this subject will be a stizzler.

Any one that favors preparedness in the United States is manifestly a scoundrel, a swindler, a liar, a thief, a murderer and a low, bad person.

Any degree of preparedness here is plainly preposterous.

Not one additional cent should be expended on army or navy, and let him that says antique stone forts and medieval guns are not sufficient for us die the death!

Existing social conditions, it may be assumed, will receive far more attention in the socialist than in any other platform.

The increasing unemployment, poverty and misery of the working class will be portrayed and denounced, and the remedy be vigorously demanded.

VINDICATED BY THE COURT
