## FRENCH AIRMEN IN NEW CRUISERS

Monster Fighting Machines Armed With Destructive "75" Guns

**YOUTH WILL COMMAND** BY HENRY WOOD United Press Staff Correspondent

PARIS, May 12.—(By Mail.)—Monster French air cruisers—each mounting one of the famous "Soixante-Quatre" guns so destructive at Verdun—will be in action against Germany's air forces before many weeks.

Successful experiments with this new terror of the air have just been completed.

In all probability, Sergt. Aviator Trelle Grandseigne, hero of recent air exploits, will pilot the first of the new battle planes.

He has been directing the experiments in which huge aeroplanes have carried the 75s in rehearsal of air engagements.

Altho but 25 years of age, Grandseigne has won for himself a most enviable record as a pilot of the first cannon-mounted aeroplanes, mounting small guns firing shells much smaller than those of the redoubtable 75s.

Grandseigne is the aviator who was cited in the order of the day for dropping 18 incendiary bombs on a Zeppelin off Zebrugge on the night of April 25.

He also carries the distinction of being the first pilot of one of the new cannon-carrying aeroplanes to engage an enemy warship.

Departing from Dunkirk about 9:30 on the night of April 14, Grandseigne was greeted with volleys of shrapnel from German warships off Neuport, Middelkerke and other Belgian towns.

He continued on to Ostend, where he opened fire on two German warships just leaving the harbor for Zebrugge.

## TWO PROMINENT MEN IN TRAGEDY

HERMISTON, Ore., May 26.—A coroner's jury was selected today to investigate the deaths of James Ralph, general manager and vice president of the Hermiston Light & Power company, and Joseph Roth, president of the company.

Officers are convinced that Roth shot and killed Ralph, then committed suicide.

The motive is not known. Residents of Hermiston believe Roth has been mentally unbalanced since the death of his son ten years ago.

The shooting occurred at 10 o'clock last night. The bodies were not discovered until an hour later. Nobody heard the shots. Ralph had been in his automobile and was returning it to a garage.

Apparently he got out of his car to open the garage door when two shots were fired from within. Death was instantaneous, physicians said. Roth's body was found in the rear of the garage, 100 feet from that of his partner.

Ralph and Roth are believed to have disagreed in their business relations.
