Q.—Will you please tell me how I can get rid of bad breath?
 A. D.
 A.—A visit to the dentist is about the most efficacious way to improve the breath. If the stomach is out of order the difficulty cannot be removed so promptly. Mixtures of foods, foods which have a strong odor, tobacco, liquor, all render the breath offensive, and should be avoided.

Q.—I have a diamond which I must sell. How can I find out its real value, and where can I sell it for the highest price?
 A.—Take your stone to any one of the large dealers and ask him to weigh it for you and tell you the prevailing price per carat. Pay a small sum for this information, if necessary. Compute the value of the diamond, according to its weight, and put an advertisement in a newspaper stating that you wish to sell a diamond of that weight.

Q.—Kindly print the meaning of "S. O. S." Some boy friends of ours say it means "Save our ship," but we think they are only kidding us.
 A.—"S. O. S." is a signal used in case of accident at sea by vessels fitted with wireless equipment. It means "Suspend other service."

Q.—I have met several men with an introduction at the place I am now working. We know when we meet on the street. Under these circumstances what should I do if I receive a formal introduction?

 A.—You are not likely to be introduced now at the office. That formality should have been attended to when you took your position. If you meet any of these men socially, acknowledge the introduction as you would any other, without comment.

Q.—I have about three pounds of tinfol. Can you tell me where I would be able to sell it, and the price per pound?

 A.—The man who buys rags and other waste materials will buy your tin or lead paper. The former is much more valuable. It is impossible to name a price, because there is no fixed rate, except in large quantities sold to wholesale dealers.

Q.—Please tell me if a British subject, coming from Canada to reside in the States, must pay duty on his furniture and other household effects.

 A.—Household goods which the owner has held and used himself for more than one year are not subject to duty. Articles which have been purchased within a year are dutiable.

Q.—Is there any difference between a camera and a kodak? If so, what is it?

 A.—The chief difference between a camera and kodak is that a camera is so constructed that sensitized plates or films must be placed at the back to receive the image and a long exposure is required; while a kodak is provided with a continued roll of sensitized film, on which successive negatives can be made with an instantaneous exposure.

Q.—I am 17 and engaged to be married this fall. My fiancée is 25. Do you think I am too young to marry?

 A.—Yes; it is considered too young to marry these days. In pioneer days many girls married at that age, and even younger. If you and your sweetheart are adapted to one another and your love is the enduring kind, you will lose nothing by waiting until you are more mature.
