Chief Beckingham will have a special detail of 100 patrolmen to keep the crowds behind the ropes which will be stretched along the sidewalks.

The Ballard band will lead a battalion of Women of the World drill teams, followed by the general delegation.

High school boys, under Col. Herbert H. Hopkins, will meet Saturday, at 2, at First ave. and Vine st., for formation.

Notices have been sent to members of the Young Men's Republican club to assemble on Wall st., between First and Second aves., at 1:30 p. m.

Mayor Shattuck of Port Orchard has declared Saturday a holiday, and steamers will leave there at 8 a. m., 9 a. m. and 11 a. m., bringing delegations to Seattle free.

Capt. Arthur P. S. Hyde, chief marshal, has appointed Gen. E. S. Gill, former adjutant general of the Arizona National Guard, marshal of the produce merchants' division.

University of Washington alumni, headed by Tom Patterson, former colonel of student cadets, will meet at Fifth ave. and Blanchard st., at 1:45 p. m. Saturday, to form their marching unit.

The Seattle Golf club will have 500 men in line, the Green Lake Improvement club 100, the Sanitary public market 300, and the Greek society 200.

### LYEN DENIED MOTION FOR A NEW HEARING

EVERETT, June 8.—Motion for a new trial of the Lyen alienation suit was denied in superior court by Judge Ralph C. Bell yesterday afternoon.

Eather Aldeen Lyen recovered \$15,000 damages from her father-in-law, J. L. Lyen, cashier of the Citizens' Bank & Trust company of Everett.

The plaintiff scored a second success in having the order assessing the costs of Cecil Lewis Lyen, the young husband, charged against Eather Aldeen Lyen reversed. Attorney John Hart won out in his contention that a husband cannot obtain judgment against his wife any more than the wife against the husband, as the jury decided.

Excepting to the instructions of the court to the jury, the attorneys for Banker Lyen have notice of appeal to the supreme court.

### DOCK MEN STILL MARKING TIME

Water front employers were waiting further developments in San Francisco Thursday morning before sending strikebreakers out to buck the longshoremen's strike.

The union officials, after their first strike conference in San Francisco Wednesday, announced they would not withdraw or change their demands.

"We will work for any or all employers who will pay the new scale and recognize our proposals," announced President J. J. Foley of the I. L. A.

No move would be made, Seattle dock men said, until after the conference of union executives with San Francisco employers today.

The meeting has been arranged by United States Immigration Commissioner Henry M. White of Seattle, who reached San Francisco late Wednesday with instructions from the federal department of labor to try and promote peace negotiations.

An entry fee of 25 cents is exacted. Each exhibitor must provide his own container.

One prize and two ribbons are offered for each class.
