### GIVE BATTER TWO SACKS, SAYS HE

CHICAGO, July 13.—Byron Bancroft Johnson, boss of the American league, would stamp out the "bean ball." His attention has been called to the frequent alleged deliberate efforts made by pitchers to disable batters by aiming pitched balls at the batter's head, and, like President Ebbets of the Brooklyn Nationals, the American league executive believes there should be a remedy.

"I am loath to believe," Johnson said, "that any player in the game would deliberately injure another, but there seems to be a growing belief that pitchers are throwing balls at players' heads in order to intimidate them and drive them away from the plate. According to the reports, that belief was largely responsible for some of the latest outbreaks on the ball field.

"In that case it may be well to provide some method of minimizing the possibility of such methods being employed by pitchers in the future. I would recommend a double penalty on the pitcher who hits a batsman on the head or neck by giving that batsman two bases arbitrarily.

"Few batsmen are hit in that way either by accident or intent, anyway, and it would not work serious handicap to double the penalty, because it would not be inflicted often, and it would tend to lessen the number of accidental blows on the head by making pitchers more cautious."
