"Hell-to-Pay Austin," at the Liberty for four days, starting tomorrow, is one of the best productions turned out from the Fine Arts studio. "Hell-to-Pay" Austin is a lumber king who earns this sobriquet because of his "mailed fist" attitude toward his underlings in camp. He is a man of the world, has seen much and sown wild oats. To the little orphan of the camp, who is nicknamed Nettles, he exhibits another side of his character. To her he is not a bully and a brow-beater, but a thoughtful, kind and courageous man. She is very much in love with him, but another woman who comes out from the past throws her unhappy shadow across their path to the altar. A Triangle comedy, with Fay Tichner in the leading role, completes the program. It's called "Skirts."

STRAND
The story of a woman's rise from proprietor of a small saloon on the West to wife of an eastern clubman is told in Sunday's new picture at the Strand, which features Virginia Pearson, "Daredevil Kate." The workmen at Devil's Gap are dissatisfied with the treatment they receive from their eastern headquarters, so they come from their town of several easterners. One of these is Cliff Stone, another is Irene West, Stone's adopted sister, and the third is John West, Irene's husband. Stone and West are to take over the management of the western works of the company. Kate at first takes sides with the new arrivals, for she has fallen in love with Cliff Stone. But Irene's unwarranted interference in their romance turns her against the intruders, and she decides to help the miners, and not the managers.

ALHAMBRA
"The Ne'er Do Well," Rex Beach's masterpiece, which is at the Alhambra, starting Sunday, is more stirring and colorful than any of his others. The scenes are very timely laid in Panama, and it contains even a greater, more holding fascination than that of his Alaskan tales. The acts are swift and full of incident, the exciting episodes numerous; and the tension does not let down in between times, as is the case with most pictures that one sees on the screen. A large and complete cast is headed by Kathryn Williams and Wheeler Oakman and the entire company which made "The Spoilers" famous. "The Ne'er Do Well" is filmed in nine stirring, heart interest parts, replete with action.
