The True Story of the Poor Girl Without a Home, Who's Hunting a Husband



HIGH COURT IS FIRM ON EDEN

Won't Change Decision That Booze Bought Before Jan. 1 Is Legal

HARD ON PROSECUTORS
Prosecutor Lundin and 14 other attorneys who recently petitioned the supreme court for a rehearing of the John C. Eden liquor case, on the ground that the court's first decision robbed them of a vital point in enforcing the dry law, felt Monday that "the buck" had been passed right back to them.

The court decided Saturday that the Eden case was closed, and that the first decision would stand as it looked, but denied that the law had lost its force. It is now possible, under the supreme court's ruling, Lundin says, for persons who have an excess amount of liquor in their possession to evade the law by merely stating that they bought the liquor before last January.

"If we can't prove it was acquired after the dry law became operative," he said, "we lose the case." Eden's stock of liquor, seized by the sheriff last winter, was purchased, Eden said, before January 1, and was ordered returned to him by the supreme court. Lundin, backed by 15 other prosecutors, appealed for a new decision. This the supreme court declined to give, Saturday.
