**ECHO HEARD OF THE BALLINGER CASE**  
SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 23.—As an aftermath of the Ballinger-Pinchot controversy, the federal district court is considering an action filed by the United States against Louis R. Glavis, former chief of the Pacific coast land office division, to recover \$320.  
It is alleged that Glavis, as special disbursing agent, paid himself that amount as chief of the land office, for the expense of a trip to confer with President Taft and Gifford Pinchot, in behalf of the latter, just before Ballinger resigned as secretary of the interior. The government asserts the continental trip was unauthorized.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—Hogs are now selling at \$11.30 per 100 pounds because last year's corn crop was "soft," the United States department of agriculture announces. The corn being soft, it could not be kept for feed, and was immediately disposed of. This produced a scarcity of feed.

**DAIRIES TO CUT DOWN H. C. OF L.**  
Begin Campaign to Show High Cost of Living Can Be Reduced  
**ORGANIZE A COMPANY**

Appropriating \$7,500 as a publicity fund to educate the public on the food value of dairy products, and to show how they will actually reduce the cost of living, the producers and distributors of milk, ice cream, cheese and butter held an enthusiastic meeting in the Seattle Chamber of Commerce Tuesday night, at which a permanent organization was effected.  
The Dairy Products Publicity bureau is the name of the new organization, which is headed by the following: A. N. Henderson, chief milk inspector of Seattle; H. Walstad, manager of the Kristoferson Dairy; H. A. Kyer, of Augustine & Kyer; A. B. Tierney, president of the Snohomish County Dairymen's association, and H. C. Lind, of the Seattle Private Dairymen's association.

A rousing celebration of Dairy Day, the first of its kind to be held in the United States, will officially start the campaign in the Arena October 7, in conjunction with the Northwestern Land Products show.  
Milk Inspector Henderson, who presided at last night's meeting, reported that enthusiastic support in this campaign had been pledged by public school officials and members

of the parent-teacher associations throughout the city.  
No less than 5,000 inventions have been submitted to the naval board in seven months.
