American Labor Wants No "Slave" Act

THE railroad brotherhoods, and all other labor organizations oppose and will fight to the bitter end any legislation patterned after the Canadian industrial disputes act.

The Canadian industrial disputes act provides that employees may not quit work pending official investigation and the publication of findings—all of which may be indefinitely delayed.

The Canadian act is as foreign to every principle of American life and government as King George himself is. It provides for compulsory service during an indefinite period. Compulsory service is nothing but involuntary servitude, and involuntary servitude is nothing but slavery, no matter how it may be disguised by fine legal phrases.

The Canadian act, by prohibiting strikes for any period whatever, gives the employer time to prepare, to hire strike breakers and gunmen and to lay in supplies. It has all the effects of an injunction in an aggravated form.

The Canadian act works ruin to any union or body of unorganized workers who are forced to submit to it. It injures the weaker and more helpless employees more than it does the strong unions. It would forever prevent the organization of any railroad workers who are not now in strong unions. It would cripple those which are now strong.

The Canadian act is a gun placed at the heads of the workers by the government with the employer's finger on the trigger.
