CITY BUILDERS MEET TO WIN ORIENT TRADE

Seattle-made manufacturers are to receive special attention and exploitation in the campaign to win Russian and Oriental trade.

This was generally agreed upon by the business men who met, as a committee, with Samuel Hill at his residence Tuesday morning, in the second of a series of meetings to discuss the newer commercial problems.

The committee, of which A. B. Stewart is chairman and O. B. Fisher is secretary, also favored the formation of the \$2,500,000 corporation suggested by J. E. Chilberg, and for which he subscribed \$100,000. That the full amount can easily be obtained, all members of the committee agreed.

This corporation is to establish agencies in the countries of Russia, Japan and China, to advertise Seattle and to keep Seattle business interests in touch with the heads of the various communities of those countries.

LAND SHOW IS READY TO OPEN

Featuring land products from Washington, Idaho, Oregon and Montana counties and communities, the Northwest Land Products exposition, Seattle's first civic event of its kind, will open at the Arena Wednesday evening. The ceremony will be in charge of the Chamber of Commerce.

The exhibits will consist of fruits, grains, grasses and vegetables. Alaska has sent a display of grains and hardy vegetables together with mineral exhibits. The Alaska display will be arranged by the Alaska bureau of the Chamber of Commerce and will be under canvas in the park adjoining the Metropolitan theatre.

Fifth ave., from University st. to Seneca st., is also covered with canvas, and this, with the Arena, provides more than 70,000 square feet of exhibit space for the exposition.

The show will be open morning, afternoon and night. Ferrullo's Italian band, from Chicago, is in the city for the event as the leading musical attraction. The state college at Pullman will be represented on the daily lecture program by five departments.

CHARITY HEAD RAPS 1915 LAW

"In my judgment, the mothers' pension law should be amended or wholly changed so as to afford the relief originally intended for all mothers and dependent children who need it."

J. J. Callaghan, King county commissioner of public welfare, makes the above recommendation in his annual report to the county commissioners.

As charity commissioner, Callaghan disbursed aid to 123 deserted and divorced women and 387 children lacking a father's care, all of whom would have come under the benefits of a "just mothers' pension law."

"The change in the mothers' pension law of this state resulted in increased demands on this department," says Callaghan.

"These demands had to be dealt with according to the merits of each case, no matter what had been the means which deprived the mothers and children of their natural protectors. In fact, the investigators of this department discovered numerous cases where mothers were too proud to appeal for help or for some other reason were unable to communicate with this department, where help was sorely needed and was promptly given."
