GIRLS OF 60 ATTEND BIG NIGHT SCHOOL

School girls of 60 strolled down the halls of Broadway high school Monday night with lads of 70, just as enthusiastic as the 17-year-old students who rubbed their shoulders.

In every face of the 3,380 which appeared at the opening session of night school there appeared the sincere determination to get that which had been denied them, or because of their own thoughtlessness they had let pass by.

Every class and age are to be found in that crowd of students. There are foreigners, who are unable to speak more than a few words of English. These will enter the classes in Americanization, where they will learn the language and customs of their native country.

Advanced classes are offered for persons wishing to take out their naturalization papers.

The commercial, the home economic, manual training and academic courses are all well filled.

"The courses are practical," Night Principal Kirkpatrick said, "and all that we ask is that the students do not try to do too much, and that they conduct themselves in such a manner that it will be complimentary to the school."


There will be about 90 teachers on the staff, and the enrollment, in all probability, will make this the largest night school in the United States.

Teachers in charge say that there is room to handle 2,500 students. There are two divisions, one meeting on Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights, while the other meets on Tuesday and Thursday. Information concerning the courses offered may be obtained by calling the high school or A. L. Brown, at the board of education offices, in the Central building.

Some of the courses offered are: English, grammar, languages, physics, chemistry, cooking, sewing, all commercial and manual training subjects, gymnasium and music.

Letters found at the Commerce hotel, where the pair is said to have stayed the night previous to the murder, indicate that Mrs. St. John came here to meet Alerton after a correspondence between the two had been established by a matrimonial bureau. Alerton is believed to have slain her to get her money.
