### Lone Woman Who Wears Her Hair Cut Like Man's Backs Free Art School

Nine chairs, two of which are without unbroken seats, in an otherwise empty, time-worn room in the old abandoned court house, comprise the present physical equipment of Seattle's free art school.

It opened Monday.

There are 22 students, ranging from a 15-year-old boy with blond hair and deumpy eyes to a knotty-fisted deputy sheriff subject to order by Robert Hodge.

Then there is Miss L. A. Mint, formerly of Philadelphia. She is voluntary instructor and national director of the National Liberal Art and Science League.

Her hair, turned gray, she wears cut short, like a man's. Keen, good natured eyes flash under heavy brows.

Her whole thought today, as it has been for more than 25 years, is to teach men and women the principles of art, and now to give Seattle an institution that shall be free as the air.

She was the only one left in the ugly room, turned over by the county commissioners, late Thursday afternoon. Students had gone.

"Unless there are 100 people who want to study in a free art school," she said, calmly, "this thing will be abandoned. And unless there is public spirit enough among some generous individuals here, we will close for want of some \$35 a month to keep this project on its feet."

She told how she has labored giving art instruction, always free, to ambitious students, in 15 states, ever since she was a young graduate from art school.

This struggling five-day-old institution is no bustling, optimistic affair.

It is rather a gaunt, empty hope so far. The few students, the one generous hearted woman and the nine battered chairs form the background for a big idea.

The doors at present open at 1 p. m. Classes are held for pupils of all ages over 15, all afternoon and from 7 until 9 p. m.
