



KEEL OF LARGEST BATTLESHIP BUILT ON COAST IS LAID

MARE ISLAND NAVY YARD, Cal., Oct. 25.—In the presence of thousands of wildly cheering Californians, the keel of the super-dreadnaught California, the largest warship ever put under construction on the Pacific coast, was laid here at noon today.

United States Senator James D. Phelan and officials of the navy yard represented the government, and Congressman Curry, Mayor James Roney of Vallejo and state and municipal officials formed the riveting gang that hammered the first rivets into place and began actual work of construction.

The ceremonies took place at noon, after the battleship Oregon, famous "Bulldog of the Navy," and itself a product of a San Francisco bay shipyard, brought the party of officials and prominent citizens.

Ready by 1918 It is the intention to launch the California in January, 1918. She will be completed and ready for a trial trip a year later.

The California's specifications are the latest ideas in naval construction, largely the result of careful study of naval engagements in the European war. The big ship has many features not to be found on ships now in service.

Specially Armored

The armoring of the vessel is planned to guard against torpedo attacks and mines. Naval constructors believe the ship will be impregnable against such attacks.

The super-dreadnaught will be 624 feet long, 96 feet in width and 47 feet 2 inches deep. At her mean draft of 30 feet 3 inches she will have a displacement of 32,300 tons, and will be capable of sustaining a speed of 21 knots an hour for 12 continuous hours.

Twelve Giant Guns The California's principal battery will be 12 14-inch 50-caliber breech-loading rifles. These guns are to be of an exceptionally powerful type. They will be mounted in three, in four center line turrets, which will be heavily armored. The remainder of the armament includes 22 five-inch rapid-fire guns, four submerged torpedo tubes, four six-pounders (mainly for saluting), four three-inch anti-aircraft guns, two one-pounder guns for ship's boats, a three-inch landing piece and several 30-caliber machine guns.

The California's machinery is to be operated by electricity. This will be furnished by mammoth generators, driven by oil-burning turbines. When completed and fully named, the California will have a complement of 58 officers and 1,022 men.





The VITAL stands for the practical. The MENTAL and MOTIVE more often stress the ideal.



If, for instance, I wanted to support a state senator who would be likely, aside from his public professions, to help put thru a rather radical humanitarian piece of legislation, I should select the mental-motive type shown in the accompanying illustration, rather than the other, inclining toward the vital.

It is natural that some mistaken estimates can thus be made, but nature's signboards on a man's face and physique show where his strongest TENDENCIES lie.

Analyzing the photograph of Governor Hiram Johnson of California, it shows just the sort of man his achievements have proven him.

The head and features testify that he is primarily MOTIVE, the good combination of the three fundamental types. His humanitarian tendencies are strong; he has business shrewdness; is a hearty eater; is strongly social, large in friendship, indicating a good mixer; is practical, broad minded, aggressive and progressive.

Natural characteristics should be the public man's qualification for or political service where investigation, studiousness and vision are essential.

A man's features, physique and deportment are as reliable guides to his probable political activities as they are in any other phase of life.

The voter may thus get a pretty fair estimate of a candidate's character and tendencies, even though his record is obscure or his capacities unproven.

The MENTAL type of man, with the TRIANGULAR face, should be selected for that character of public

office. I have been able only to hint at the definite principles of character analysis here, and to indicate how they may be applied in the selection of public officials and representatives. There are, however, many sources where such helpful knowledge can be obtained.
