They say they were told at that time that all the brewers asked was to be allowed to open their plants in Washington and supply beer under the permit system instead of having the beer shipped in from the outside, and for export purposes. But when the bill came forth from the Brewery lawyers it told a different story.

It had killed the permit system. It had opened the state to every brewer in the country to ship beer in and sell and deliver on the same basis as the local brewers.

It had made it legal for the bootlegger to buy at wholesale and keep in his possession. It had left the small sales entirely to him.

It had taken all local control from the cities and towns.

It provides no revenue except the few brewery licenses that would be taken out, and the insignificant barrel tax, which goes to the road fund.

It had provided no enforceable penalty except for failure to take out brewery license.

It would put the SALOON on WHEELS all over the state.

It would put a BOOZE SOLICITOR at every door.

It would practically put the present Dry Law out of business.

Thousands of these signers were pretty sore when they had seen the bill itself. And some of them are openly out against it, while many others, with a hatchet, are silently nursing their wounds.

But No. 24 had to be PRETTY RANK to keep step with its Twin Brother 18.

Vote against both of them and keep the brewer out of the state—he always fights on the wrong side.

NEW YORK, Oct. 28.—The great Nazimova turned to me with that characteristically quick movement others "birdlike" when I called upon her for her ideas on love and marriage. Then she held up her hands and her face took on a look that expressed half amusement, half petulance.

"WHY do you ask me these age-old questions about love and marriage? Go out into the street and grab the first woman you meet. She can answer them as well as I."

"BUT," I answered, "Madame Nazimova is the great feminine 'lure' of the drama. On the stage men ruin themselves nightly and die for just the chance to press the hem of her gown."

"Oh," she said, with a faint smile, "that is not love. THAT IS IMAGINATION, and you know how imagination plays some fantastic tricks with all of us."

"How long, madame," I asked, "do you think romantic love, the love that is the theme of poets and dramatists, lasts?"

"Never having experienced it, unless you take into account a childish adoration I had for my music teacher, when I was 9 years old, I cannot tell," she answered.

I remonstrated. "Surely, as an artist you will not deny that it is love that makes the world go round!"

"Perhaps, but the world circled in the planetary system many eons before romantic love was born. Did you not know that romantic love, as we know it, is only about a thousand years old?"

"In the soul of Dante romantic love was conceived, and not until his wonderful 'Vita Nuova' was written was the supposed superlative and lasting adoration of one man for one woman put into definite language."

"And yet every great lover, from Heine, Goethe and Sainte Beuve, to those much lesser ones of today, has demonstrated that love rarely lasts, with its mingled ecstasies and anguish, more than TWO YEARS! Indeed, Sainte Beuve declares that it can never outlive five years. I scarcely am one to doubt their observations."

"Personally, I believe that the fact that so many of our great stories and poems and dramas since Dante have been written for the glorification of romantic love is a great factor in the matrimonial unrest of today; for no sane person can but admit that this peculiar phase of love must undergo a metamorphosis in wedlock. WE ALL COME TO AGREE WITH THE CYNICS THAT MARRIAGE IS THE ONLY SURE CURE FOR LOVE."

"Why not be sensible, then, and take this cure with our eyes open, knowing that when the so-called 'romance' subsides, its place may be taken by another group of emotions equally noble, and if not as exciting, perhaps more satisfying in the end, as well as more conducive to the welfare of ourselves and society?"

Just then the handsome husband of Nazimova came up and rested his hand caressingly about the shoulders of the little woman who might be described as exactly as tall as his heart. She looked up quickly at his touch, and a smile that Nazimova has never vouchsafed to the gaze of one of her theatre audiences, radiated her face. It gave me an inspiration.

"What, madame, is your idea of an ideal husband?"

Nazimova's little hand stole up to the white ones clasping her shoulder, and she answered without an instant's hesitation, "A MAN WHO IS TOLERANT."

"And a great lover?" I asked.

"A great lover is usually THE MOST INTOLERANT OF MEN. Is she right, wives? Do you place tolerance first of the wedded masculine virtues?"


