

Soldier Son Bids Dad Good-Bye in Ronald's Court

The stern rules that guard a jury were waived just as far as Judge Ronald could stretch them Tuesday afternoon, to let J. W. Efav, 117 24th ave., one of the alternate jurors in the I. W. W. trial, and his son, L. F. Efav, of Company 6, coast artillery, say good-bye to each other.

Young Efav, who expects to be ordered away at any moment, came up to the courtroom just before court convened in the afternoon and asked to see his father, if possible, for a few moments. Judge Ronald sent for the attorneys on both sides of the case, who promptly agreed.

To safeguard the interview from any possible objection, however, the juror sat on one side of the threshold of the juryroom and the young soldier, in his olive-drab uniform, on the other, with bailiffs close by. "Don't bring in the jury until they get thru," ordered Judge Ronald, and the trial waited while father and son talked.

They said little, and said it in low voices, seeming not to notice the bailiffs and the curious crowd that watched them from the benches. When they finished, there was a quick grip of hands. "Good-bye, father!" "Good-bye, son!" That was the way they parted.

Tong Men Must Come to Terms or Leave U. S.

Seattle is going to take drastic steps to stop the Chinese tong war. Mayor Gill has called a conference of tong leaders for 3 p. m. Saturday afternoon. All those who do not attend, and are subject to deportation, will be promptly deported by Commissioner of Immigration Henry M. White. It is believed peace can be agreed upon by the tong men at this conference.

Don't Leave Auto in 'War Zone,' Says Chief
