**CASH FOR INDUSTRY**

Chamber to Start Fund to Aid Factories

"A fund in which every one who desires may invest, and from which sums can be taken to aid deserving industries."

This plan, discussed by the Chamber of Commerce for some time, was made public today by Secretary Gordon C. Corbaley, as the first, definite, "money talks" step to encourage local industries. "There has been considerable discussion over bringing industries here," said Corbaley. "I think we are now ready for more than talk. What we're proposing follows the German plan of industrial banks, investors put their money in them and suitable industries are established by syndicates.

Not Subsidies  
 "And so here, behind the central fund will go the best brains of Seattle to direct its use and encourage the user, who will be the manufacturer or company who has a good industrial proposition, but lacks some of the capital needed.

The money thus used in his plant will not be a bonus, but an investment. Legitimate business and industry does not require subsidies. It needs friendly capital. "The enlarged industrial bureau of the Chamber will make surveys of local industries already established, and which can profitably be established, together with all elements entering into their successful launching, such as raw materials, suitable sites, prospective markets, power rates, labor supply and labor conditions.

Aid Local Factories  
 "These surveys will be followed by an active campaign to induce industries to come to Seattle, especially those which can be helped thru the foreign trade bureau, and which may have, already, some

trade developed with countries bordering on the Pacific.

"At no time will factories already established be overlooked. Everything, it is intended, shall be done to foster and develop their trade."


