Russ Officer Runs Away From Army to Locate in Seattle

If anybody sees Arcady Tominech, who is an officer in the Russian army, he will confer a favor on "His Excellency, the Sheriff of Seattle, Washington, North America," and also upon Mrs. Nadya Tominech, who is the wife of the above, and who can't obtain a divorce until hubby gets the papers issued from the consistory at Vladivostok.

Mrs. Tominech has written from Tomaska, Russia, to Sheriff Stronger, asking that he locate hubby, who deserted from the Russian army, and to inform the Russian consul of his whereabouts.
Inasmuch as no description of the man was inclosed, the sheriff's bloodhounds have not yet picked up his trail.

Joe Parrot, who escaped from the ward for the criminally insane at Medical Lake Sunday, was captured in Leavenworth Thursday night by Sheriff McManus.

SUIT OVER PEARLS

Two thousand five hundred dollars worth of pearls are on exhibition in Judge Ronald's court. S. Tanaka and T. Takiguchi are suing S. Friedlander, Seattle Jeweler, for \$790. The claim arises out of a partnership between the three whereby the Japanese were to buy pearls for Friedlander. The tray containing the jewels was dropped in court Thursday and one pearl valued at \$65 cracked open.

PREPARE WAYS TO HUNT DOWN U. S. SLACKERS

While the Central Council for Patriotic Service and Gov. Lister are considering plans for a celebration to be held on the day Seattle's young men go to the places of registration to tell Uncle Sam they are ready to serve in the cause of democracy, Mayor Hiram C. Gill, Sheriff John Stringer and City Registration Clerk William Gaines are busy arranging for the actual work of the registration.

Mayor Gill has placed the details of registration for Seattle in Gaines' hands, and for the last week Gaines has been taking the names of volunteers who will assist at the registration places and arranging for registration places. The fire halls and the school houses will be used, and also private homes and stores. Altho lacking detailed information from the war department, Mayor Gill, Chief of Police Beckingham and Sheriff Stringer have been giving "slackers" much thought.

Police Co-operate
"Every policeman and detective in Seattle will be on the lookout for those who fail to register," says Chief Beckingham. "The mayor has told me that it is up to this department to see that every male in Seattle between 21 and 31 is registered, and we are going to do our best."

The age question has been a subject of controversy, but Mayor Gill and Registrar Gaines are decided that to be eligible a man must have passed his 21st birthday, while he is exempt if he is as much as one day past his 31st.

Watch for Fraud
"It is going to be hard to prevent fraud," says Sheriff Stringer, "and if a man wants to lie we will have a hard time catching him at it. Of course we will look up birth certificates, and in cases of reasonable doubt we will wire the town he says he lives in. With the aid of the police in the city and the deputies in the county we shall do what we can to minimize the giving of false names. In cases where there is evident attempt to deceive, we shall prosecute to the full extent."

After the registration has been made and certificates issued to those who register it will be easy to pick up the slackers, the officials say. If a man is over the age the physicians can tell it, and most times he will be more willing to stand his chances of service than to go to jail as the law provides.

Lists of the men who register will probably be printed and posted, according to word from Washington. Citizens who know of men who evade registration will be expected to report them. Those who fail to register will be liable to imprisonment.

National Guardsmen, according to registration officials, will be required to sign up the same as other citizens. Exemption claims will be worked out later. This procedure is intended to serve as a civil as well as a military census, so every one between the ages of 21 and 30, inclusive, will be required to register. County Auditor Wardall has received replies from 75 out of 140 rural precincts, stating registration places have been arranged. Large instruction cards are being prepared, and each man who registers will be given a card to keep as evidence if he is accused of not registering.


