PETROGRAD, May 5.—Babushka, "grandmother of the revolution" and most of all feared by the former Russian autocracy, is back from Siberia, enjoying the freedom of the new democracy after an exile of 43 years.

Babushka is the nickname of Mme. Catherine Breshkovskaya daughter of a Russian noble and 73 years of age. Her activities against the Russia autocracy and kindnesses for the people won her the title by which every radical in Russia knew her—"grandmother of the Russian revolution."

Had to Leave Home
While in her teens Babushka pleaded so strongly for freedom of the people her parents forced her to leave home.

Cared for Comrades
Returning to Russia, she was re-arrested again. In spite of her own unfortunate situation, she used all her efforts caring for her comrades in exile.

Babushka's reward is the revolution. Honors are being given thruout Petrograd, and she is hailed as the heroine of the new Russia.

The Woman's Army Against Waste Oatmeal Bread for Breakfast Toast

TODAY'S WASTOGRAM
—Fight your fixed habits of eating; preference for white bread is only a habit.

"What shall I use instead of toast for breakfast?" a housewife asked after a little neighborhood talk in one of the homes recently. "My family will eat only toast for breakfast, and the daily consumption of white bread for this meal alone is nearly two loaves. With bread in our locality 15 cents a loaf and the cry going up all over the country that we must save wheat and wheat flour, I feel that in some way I am playing a traitor to my country in not finding a substitute for this."

"Rise bread, whole wheat bread and brown bread are all good toasted," answered one woman present. "Oatmeal bread is most delicious, and having nuts in it, no meat or eggs are necessary for a breakfast when it is served, even for those who do manual labor."

be made for 50 cents in your kitchen.
"I usually make this bread in three loaves, and my children would rather have it than cake. When it is fresh they eat it without butter, and they always exclaim delightedly when they see it on the table toasted for breakfast."
Here is the recipe: Two cupsful dry rolled oats; 1/2 cup shortening; 1/2 cupful sugar; 2 level teaspoonfuls salt. Boil over the 2 cupsful of boiling water and set aside to cool. Put 2 cakes of compressed yeast or 1 yeast foam into 1 cupful of tepid water. When first mixture is cool, add yeast and water and 2 1/2 cupful of nutmeats. Knead into this enough white flour to make a dough a little stiffer than white bread, mold into two large or three small loaves, allow it to double in size in raising, bake in a moderate oven 50 minutes.


