

ALLIES HURL THEMSELVES ON HINDENBURG'S BATTERED LINE

WAR SITUATION TODAY Shows Today's Action



WEST FRONT—Allies unite in pressing entire Hindenburg line. British make another sharp advance beyond newly gained positions on Wytschaete-Messines line, near Warneton. Artillery bombardments continue between opposing French and German forces with increasing vigor.

ITALIAN FRONT—Italians take 500 prisoners as they launch another offensive in the Trentino, while Austrian forces are ordered in the same area to try and block further Italian advances. Other fronts fail to report any marked activity.

LONDON, June 12.—On every Western front today, allied pressure was squaring the Teutonic grip with increasing strength. Field Marshal Haig, profiting by his newly won and dominating positions at Wytschaete-Messines ridge, forced relinquishment by the enemy of an additional patch of Belgian territory, just west of Warneton, and was gaining elsewhere on this same general front.

To the south the French pressure on the base of the now badly battered Hindenburg line was steadily increasing in a conflict marked by intense artillery firing.

At this particularly timely moment Italy is apparently started on another offensive. This time the blow is in the Trentino—adding another theatre of active fighting to the great war's development.

Grip Tightening

Italy has just concluded the first stage of one highly successful offensive in the Carso. Austria must keep her forces constantly manned there to meet the menace of Gen. Cadorna's ever-tightening grip on Trieste, now almost in sight of the Italian fighters. Today she must likewise hurry reserves to the Trentino, in efforts to stop encroachment on her own territory.

What makes the new Italian drive of particular interest is the fact that the fighting is over Teuton ground. It is one of the few places in the world-war, in Europe at least, where the Teutons are finding the battle brought home to them on their own land.

Message May Help

There is still hope here that Russia may be revived into active participation in the fighting. Just now military experts realize Germany has thinned her lines on the Russian front in order to mass reserves against allied attacks elsewhere.
