

GERMANS GIVEN JAIL TERM FOR INDIAN PLOTS

CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—Gustav Jacobson, Wehde and George Paul Boehm, German aliens, today were sentenced to three years' imprisonment at Leavenworth penitentiary, and fined \$13,000 each for conspiracy to foment a revolution in India.

The Germans also were sentenced to two years' imprisonment for actual carrying out of the conspiracy, but the sentences will be served concurrently.

SPURCK SR. SAYS KENNEDY WRONG

William Spurck, of Sunnyside, Wash., father of William Spurck, Jr., who was recently certified by the district court, after a fight against being drafted, that culminated with gubernatorial action, has written a letter to the appeal board, taking exception to statements made by Appeal Agent Thomas Kennedy, that he is a German.

In denying this, the elder Spurck says that both he and his wife were born in America, and that they subscribed to both the Liberty Loan and the Red Cross.

"My son has earned, to my knowledge, during the last four years approximately \$12,000," his letter states.

Spurck, Jr., was certified on the ground that he has not supported his wife, but has had an income from his father.

NO TRACE IS FOUND OF MISSING SISTERS

Police have been unable to find trace of May and Birdie McElfresh, missing schoolgirls, who disappeared October 29. They are daughters of Mrs. Charles McElfresh, 9327 47th ave. S.

They had been attending private school at Second ave. N. and Thomas st.

Reports that the girls were seen at Camp Murray October 21 have been received, but, according to the mother, the friend who thought he saw them was not certain as to their identity.

HE SAYS SILENCE PROMOTES VICE

Moral slovenliness, aided by parental modesty, and a conspiracy of silence, are a few of the contributory causes for the present spread of the "social evil" in Seattle.

These causes were summed up by Rev. J. E. Crowther, pastor of the First M. E. church, in a sermon Sunday night against the spread of disease and sin which is gradually sweeping over the city of Seattle.

Mayor Gill was praised for the excellent manner in which he prosecuted the bootleggers, and in the next breath condemned for his slackness in regard to immoral women.

"This social evil affects more lives than any other problem," said Rev. Crowther, in a voice ringing with indignation.

"Helen Keller, born blind, is a victim of this social evil. She says that one out of every four babies who are born blind are the victims of the sins of their fathers.

"Parental modesty may be said to be the very root of the evil. This conspiracy of silence allows a boy to become a slave before he knows where he is headed for.

"Society consents to a double standard. Every woman who goes wrong has been started by a man. Man is to blame, not the woman. Yet she is an outcast and the man is not."
