## LLOYD GEORGE VISITS ITALIAN BATTLE FRONT

ROME, Nov. 9.—Premier Lloyd George and other British officials were at the Italian front today, visiting the king of Italy and inspecting Franco-British troops sent to reinforce Cadorna's men.

Official announcements today said that a dozen bridges over the Livorno river had been blown up, and that the fighting line now extended over a front of scarcely 30 miles.

GERMANS CROSS LIVENZA BERLIN, via London, Nov. 9.—"The Livenzas have been crossed and the Italian rear guard overcome," declared the war office today.

"We are ceaselessly advancing along the mountain roads and the plain toward the Piave river."

## PELZ ADDS 'PEP' TO SMOKE FUND DAY AT STRAND

Cake Donated by Steamship Admiral Watson Produces \$78 Among Passengers

Pelz, the orchestra leader, is also an ex-soldier, having fought in the Russo-Japanese war, in which he won the rank of colonel.

Edward Everett Hale's patriotic story, "The Man Without a Country," will be the screen offering, while the musical program will be composed of an overture, "If I Were King," sextet from "Lola" with a brass sextet, and a jazz number, "Whistling and the Dog."

Mlle. Betrina will sing a popular melody.

Seventy-eight dollars and a cake two feet high have been added to the tobacco fund by the management and passengers of steamship Admiral Watson, of the Pacific Steamship Co. fleet, on its recent trip to Seattle from Alaska.

The cake was made by H. A. Clair, chef of the steamer, and was donated by the company. It was then raffled off for the benefit of The Star tobacco fund, and John McDonough of Seward won it. ## LONDON PRESS IS PESSIMISTIC ABOUT RUSSIA

By United Press Leased Wire LONDON, Nov. 9.—Kerensky's fall at Petrograd means indefinite prolongation of the war, according to belief of the London press.

It also means, in the belief of editorial writers, that heretofore a heavier burden is saddled on the United States and the allies. The seemingly inevitable civil war was held to mean further disorganization, permitting withdrawal of more German troops from the Russian front—if not worse. A majority of the London press made no concealment of its pessimism regarding Lenin and Trotsky, the two figures now in control at Petrograd. Both are regarded as entirely pro-German in sympathy. Hope was expressed that their movement was superficial and confined to Petrograd alone, but the situation was regarded as gloomy. 2,200 FLYERS WILL TRAIN AT VANCOUVER VANCOUVER, Wash., Nov. 9.—An army aviation school with 2,200 student flyers will be established here in quarters soon to be vacated by the 14th and 44th Infantry regiments, it became known today. The two regiments will go to Camp Lewis.
