

NO SOLDIER WHO ISN'T FIT WILL GO TO FRANCE

TACOMA, Nov. 9.—The most rigid medical examination ever given an army is that to which the 91st division at Camp Lewis will be subjected within the next ten days, according to medical officers here today.

While all the men have been thoroughly examined already, they will again be brought before the examining commissions, in companies, and physicians will pick from the ranks those who they think should have special examinations. Tuberculosis or predisposition to tuberculosis, nervous affections and the condition of the soldiers' feet particularly will engage the attention of the medical men.

Even the disposition of the individual will be taken into account. If any soldier is found to be harboring a protracted or unreasonable grouch, if he is subject to fits of temper, or is more than normally stupid, he will be sent to the psychiatric department for observation.

The tuberculosis commission will inspect every man, including officers, in camp, and any latent case that may be discovered will be isolated.

In short, no American soldier may go to France for active duty in the war unless he is mentally and physically sound in every particular.

The advance holds pending such changes in the price of coal as may be fixed by the president, following the hearing to be held November 12 in the County-City building, when the state fuel administrator will decide whether or not an increase is justifiable.



\$25,000,000 STEEL PLANT HERE SOON

Bart L. Thane, general manager of the Gastineau Mining Co. of Thane, Alaska, is in Seattle completing arrangements for the construction of a \$25,000,000 steel mill in this city.

Thane says that the plant will begin production within 18 months. However, the mill will not be completed by that time, owing to the extremely slow work required in establishing a large plant.

The output of the plant will be devoted entirely to government work. Much of the steel manufactured will be used for ship plates.


