COMPANY EMPLOYEES TO RAISE BIG SPUD CROP

JOHNSONBURG, Pa., April 26.—Potatoes are being made to grow where they have never grown before and on land which it was thought was not capable of producing such a crop. A company, which manufactures paper and chemical fibre has turned over a large tract of land to its employees here for this purpose. They are doing the same thing at their Loch Haven plant and at another in Willsborough, N. Y. A. G. Paine, Jr., president of the company, announces that they expect to produce as much as 6,000 bushels of potatoes here. At Loch Haven the crop is expected to be between 1,500 and 1,600 bushels, and at Willsborough 3,600 bushels. K. C. "FREEDOM FOR ALL, FOREVER"

JOHN BULL IS SINGING IT NOW



LONDON, April 26.—"Freedom for All, Forever," the great American battle cry, has just been brought to England, and already the British people have rallied around it as a fresh slogan for victory. The words of the new battle cry were first uttered in England by Judge Henry Neil of Chicago, who spoke recently on "What America is Fighting For" to a huge London audience. "The English speaking peoples of the world must stick together or be stuck separately," said Judge Neil. "America is fighting for the right of people generally to govern themselves, and will continue to the end however remote that may be. We have adopted the slogan 'Freedom for All, Forever,' and will not lay down our arms until we have made it not only a slogan but a fact." The phrase caught the popular enthusiasm and has begun to be heard on every hand, while the press and pulpit have taken it up as the best statement of allied war aims.

WHY BOYS AT FRONT DON'T GET LETTERS

WASHINGTON, April 25.—Why don't the boys at the front get their letters? Thousands of soldiers' wives and mothers have received letters from France, complaining that nothing has been heard from home, when letter after letter has been written. Here is the unvarnished reason, as given by Congressman Isaac Siegel, of New York, who has made a searching investigation in Washington and at the ports of embarkation, and has received direct eye-witness evidence from France in the last few days. Siegel has been on the trail of the postoffice department for months, and he is going to keep after it until something is done.

He says: "The entire trouble with the handling of the mail in France is a lack of coordination between the postoffice department, war department and the transportation department.

Held Two Months
"John Clark, chief postal agent in France, has repeatedly asked for more help. The mail, when received, goes to general headquarters, and all the four army field clerks have worked day and night, besides receiving help on Sundays, the mail cannot be easily distributed. Very often mail which goes to a division and which must pass up to the front is held in the rear for two months.

"At a single port there are 37,000 bags of mail, which division has been distributed, not according to the time at which they were received, but haphazardly.
