"My Garden"
How We Fed a Family and Cut Our Cost of Living With a Spade and Hoe

CHAPTER II
The success in gardening depends a lot on the planning done before the spade is used. We laid out our garden last spring. Drew a map of it, with rows all marked out. "That's a deal of extra work," my husband said, "and it looks like time wasted. Can't we go right in and sow the seeds where they fit in?" "No," I told him, "the best garden books say that a garden map is as necessary as the hoe."
"You lay out rows of small plants, such as onions, radishes, lettuce farthing south, permitting the tall plants, beans, corn and things like that to occupy the north rows. Thus you let the sunshine get to all of them."
"And you should have rows running east and west, rather than north and south for this enables the sun to get on all sides of the growing plants."
"Why not sow 'em in beds, like we used to do when I was a kid?" he asked.
"Because it has been proven that plants grow better in rows and are easier to cultivate. Beds tend to dry them in hot weather, as the moisture more quickly evaporates."
"The best plan is to divide your garden in halves, with a path down the middle. They run the rows away from the path. You can get around in it better."
"So we laid out our garden that way, first on paper. We allowed for second, and even third crops, planning our rows so that we could plant something else in them when the first crop was ripe. Sometimes we sowed seeds along the row or between rows of maturing vegetables. In that way we make the best use of the garden plot."
"But we didn't sow all the seed of any one vegetable at the same time. We provided for a succession of crops, thus having fresh vegetables for long periods. In mapping the garden, we permitted idle rows for these successive sowings. Thus we sowed half a row of radishes one week, following it the next week with another sowing of radishes, and so on during the spring. Same way with onions, lettuce, peas, etc., all quick-maturing vegetables."
"Long rows, we found, are better than short ones, even if several different vegetables are in the same row. But always we selected vegetables of about the same maturing qualities, so that the row would be harvested of all at about the same time."
"Never did we plant corn and lettuce in the same row, nor any other two vegetables requiring different spacing between plants or rows."
"I learned that, even as we feed on food, so, too, do the plants feed on food. I fed my plants well. It doesn't pay to starve your garden."

NEED 95 TONS OLD CLOTHING
Seattle Still Shy of Red Cross Quota
With a Red Cross quota of 126 tons of second-hand clothing to fill for refugee work, Seattle has only contributed 25 tons, according to officials in charge. The drive will be continued until the necessary quota is raised.
Fire stations and Red Cross headquarters, on University st. between Second and Third aves., are receiving stations for clothing.

CHICAGO STAGES WARM ELECTION
Decision Up to People After Inflammatory Campaign
CHICAGO, April 1.—Appealing to every passion and prejudice imaginable, workers for five mayoralty candidates today put the decision up to the people of Chicago. The fight between William Hale Thompson, Robert M. Sweitzer and Maclay Hoyne.
The exciting campaign ended last night in wild scenes in various parts of the city. Clashes were numerous and hostilities finally became so bitter that stink bombs were resorted to. Banners were torn down, resulting in numerous fights between rival supporters, and men and women shouted themselves hoarse. From scores of hand-wagons that paraded the loop district until far into the night.
To prevent recurrences today, Chief of Police Garrity detailed reserves to patrol the 2,215 voting precincts and guarded crowded sections of the city.
Candidates' managers freely predicted that no less than 700,000 of the registered vote of 792,000 will be cast. It was pointed out that no previous campaign had been so bitter.
Many Predictions
Last hour predictions of pluralities issued from each camp ran from 70,000 to 175,000.
Mayor William Hale Thompson, republican nominee for reelection, declared he will receive 50 per cent of the registered vote.
Robert M. Sweitzer, democrat, will be elected by 90,000, according to predictions of his campaign managers.
Maclay Hoyne, independent, non-partisan, claimed election by 125,000.
John Fitzpatrick, labor candidate, and John M. Collins, socialist, claimed victory by from 50,000 to 75,000. Fitzpatrick said he will receive 225,000 votes.
A vote was to be taken on the liquor question for Chicago. "Dry" refused to take part in the campaign, considering it a dead issue.
The polls opened at 8 a. m. and will close at 4 p. m. Definite knowledge of the results were expected by 8 o'clock.
Following up a strong campaign for Fitzpatrick, labor party workers declared 60 local unions had ceased work for the day to picket the polls and "see that labor is given a square deal." The picketing and stoppage of work was not to be considered a strike, it was stated.

BODIES OF 11 MINERS FOUND
TRINIDAD, Col., April 1.—Burned in many cases until identification was almost impossible, the bodies of eleven miners had been recovered from the Empire mine of the Empire Coal company, near Aguilar, this morning. A gas explosion wrecked the tunnel in which the miners were working.

Leaps Into Sound; Refuses Aid; Dies
Believed to have been intoxicated, Richard Angell, 49, leaped into the water from Pier 12 at the foot of Wall st., about 6:50 p. m. Monday and drowned. Two men who ran to the assistance of Angell, thrust a long pole into the water but he refused help.
Papers in the dead man's pockets show Austria his birthplace and that he was naturalized here November 7, 1914. He registered for the draft September 12, 1918. In his pockets were a \$50 Liberty Bond, a bank book, showing deposits of \$870 and two \$5 War Savings Stamps. The body is at the morgue.

Hindenburg Told of German Failure
STOCKHOLM, April 1.—A letter written by Field Marshal Von Hindenburg on October 31, 1918, was published here today. It says: "In consequence of the Macedonian disaster with its attendant weakening of the West front and in consequence of the impossibility of replacing our great losses, there is no longer any possibility of our being able to impose peace on the enemy. It is imperative to cease the struggle to save the central powers from unnecessary sacrifices."
