

SEATTLE'S ARGUMENT

ESTABLISHMENT of free zones at several of the most important seaports is now before Congress. Senator Wesley L. Jones, of Washington, has introduced a bill providing for such establishment. The commercial interests of the Pacific Coast are vitally interested in this legislation, so much so that representatives recently met in New York to consider the question. At these conferences the sentiment was expressed that action to provide free ports should be taken at this session of congress.

The establishment of free ports means much to Pacific Coast ports. It means that the way will be provided for the upbuilding of industries and commerce such as has developed the largest port of Europe. Free ports provide facilities for the repacking, blending, mixing, cleaning and other manipulations or changes of goods to be reshipped after being received from foreign countries; or for distribution as manufactured articles for domestic consumption.

Utility of Free Port

"Free port" is the term applied to a certain specified zone within seaport facilities where raw material from foreign countries may be deposited for an indefinite time without the present prevailing duties being levied by the federal government. Under the present laws all goods imported from foreign countries are subject to duties as soon as unloaded from vessels.

Within the free port zone the goods may be manufactured, repacked or handled in various ways and then reshipped and distributed without the payment of duties unless shipped to domestic points.

It has been the history of the great industrial and commercial ports of the world that large manufacturing centers have developed as a result of the free port's presence.

The United States is practically the only large nation which does not make use of the free port system. Even Japan recently has established free ports. The United States continues the obsolete practice of levying duties as soon as cargoes are discharged.

With free ports the purchaser of raw materials in foreign lands may bring these goods to America, where excellence of workmanship insures a finer finished product than probably would be possible if manufactured elsewhere. Then, if so desired, the finished products might be reshipped to other countries without the payment of import duties, or if desired distributed throughout the United States after payment of duty on that portion shipped to domestic ports.

Two Pacific Zones

In the discussions of free ports for the United States, it generally is conceded that the Pacific Coast should have two free zones, one at Seattle and the other at San Francisco. Seattle's position as the leading seaport of the west coast, it is believed, will have great weight in deciding where the free zones shall be established. It is pointed out that politics is likely to play an important part in the selection of free ports. For this reason the Seattle Chamber of Commerce is working actively to bring the importance of this proposition to the attention of the public.
