

SURE-FIRE BILL AT THE MOORE

Young 'Georgie' Price Stops the Show

Remember "Georgie" Price? He used to come to Seattle with "Cuddles" before that black-haired, winsome little girl became "Lila Lee" of the movies. They were juvenile stars in Gus Edwards' revues. Well, Georgie came back to the Moore Sunday without "Cuddles"—for she's a film star now—and he stopped the show. Georgie is just a kid. But those years as a juvenile star have taught him the art of successful entertaining. With his peppy imitations and his singing and his wit he completely captured Sunday's audience.

There are a lot of good things on the new bill.

Ernest Ball, whose ballads have made him a fortune, headlines the program with Maud Lambert. They sing quite up to their traditional standard.

Collins and Hart are back with their ridiculous acrobatic novelty which never fails to make people laugh salty tears.

Another old favorite troupe is on the bill—Phina & Co.—an aggregation of clever young colored folk. They have grown up on the American vaudeville stage, and seem to improve each year. They sing and dance.

Chris Richards, eccentric English comedian, who is a cartoonist, acrobatic dancer and general dealer in nonsense, won general approval.

Ralph Dunbar presents a Chau-tauqua musical program which is above average, and "Indoor Sports," a comedy reflecting the age old tactics of woman in quest of a husband, keeps the audience hilarious. This week's bill is a sure-fire arrangement from A to Z.

LEVY'S ORPHEUM

"Wedding Chimes," the offering of Levy's musical comedy company at Levy's Orpheum this week, is bubbling over with good things. Probably the most noticeable feature of the show is the addition of three new members, Oscar Gerard, clever Swede comedian, Robert Lorenzo, popular Seattle singer, and Frank Budd, a splendid tenor, who hails from the sunny South.

Gerard, with his Swedish dialect, makes a fine comedy partner for Lew White. The many scenes between the Swede and the Hebrew went over big with Sunday afternoon's audience.

A trio composed of Gerard (who possesses a fine baritone voice), Lorenzo and Budd almost stopped the show, while Gerard's solo, "Here Comes the Groom," brought forth an enthusiastic encore.

The addition of these clever male members to the company combined with the attractive feminine principals and a chorus of 24 pretty girls tend to make Mr. Levy's musical comedy show one of the best on the coast.

"Bound and Gagged" is the title of the screen serial which precedes the show.

PALACE HIP

The new bill which opened at the Palace Hip yesterday is filled with comedy. Robbins and Fulton are featured in their laughable skit, "At the Town Pump." Mr. Robbins, as the proud parent who regales the goosies at that community center, the town pump, does some character work that pleases.

Other favorites were Follette, Pearl and Hicks, a versatile trio who combines cross-fire comedy with talk and singing; Alvins and Alvins are a team of young men who offer some skillful balancing and have evolved something new in their perch balancing.

Francis and Fox prove that while clothes may not make the man, they go far toward making woman. They are two young men who exhibit some handsome wardrobe in their female impersonations.

Negro comedy of the sort designed for laughing purposes only is furnished by Hibbert and Nugent; "The Ace of Hoops" is apt billing for Howard Nichols, who has trained the diabolo and a lot of hoops to do his bidding in a very skillful and interesting manner.

WILKES

Captain Terence O'Keefe has an ultra-modern plan for getting hold of and keeping the love of a woman in "Upstairs and Down," now playing at the Wilkes theatre.

"Laugh at 'em, shake 'em, beat 'em, hug 'em, bite 'em, and kill 'em," he says, "and cut out the old-fashioned sentimental stuff." But Terry discovers on applying his method that he gets one woman too much.

When the extra woman turns out to be the sister of the girl he really cares for, he finds himself in quite a pickle. What to do with two sisters, both of whom love him, and only one of whom he loves, is the problem that Alexis Luce as Captain Terence O'Keefe solves to the merriment of the audience.

"Upstairs and Down," written by Frederick and Panny Locke Hatton, is a clever satire on the life of our modern "society folk." Co-starring with Alexis Luce is Jane Morgan as Elizabeth Chesterton.

Miss Mary Thorne appeared with the Wilkes players for the first time, playing the part of Alice Chesterton, younger sister of Betty. She vamped her way into the hearts of the spectators before the first act was half over.

Cornelia Glass, as Nancy Ives; John Nickerson, as Pierre, the chef, and Howard Russell, as Louis Le Tour, O'Keefe's man, were the other luminaries of the play.
