**HUSBANDS NOW HAVE A UNION**

Threaten to Go Out on Strike

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Eight hitherto perfectly docile husbands, all of them breadwinners for families residing in an eastern district house, organized a protective union and threatened to go on strike. They want social justice. A woman was brought into the meeting and introduced as an expert in feminine psychology. She favored a strike. As a result of her advice demands were formulated. They include: One evening off for the husbands, during which they shall go where they please; that they be permitted to play pinochle twice a week unmolested and allowed to keep their winnings; that the wives agree not to buy more than one new hat or evening gown a season; that no wife be permitted to "call her husband down" while standing near the ventilating shaft so as to humiliate her spouse; that no husband shall be obliged to help with the dishes after company has been entertained; that smoking in any room, even in bed, be permitted. Failure of the wives to comply with the demands will result in a walkout by the husbands.

**Seize Arsenal in Milwaukee Hotel**

Pistols, ammunition, dirks, I. W. W. literature and narcotics valued at \$5,000 were seized Saturday when deputy sheriffs and federal officials searched the Milwaukee hotel, 663 King st. No arrests were made. The suite of Goon Dip, Chinese consul, was invaded, but when he protested the officers withdrew. Credentials for Roy Draper, entitling him to act as an I. W. W. organizer, were found in a room. Deputy Sheriffs J. C. Conner, N. L. Lovell, D. S. Phillips, R. E. Murphy and C. R. Scoones were county officers making the raid.

**Pate Is Unable to Explain Wife's Act**

Mrs. J. H. Pate, who dropped to her death from the fourth floor of the Cobb building Saturday, will probably be buried in Tacoma, her husband announced Monday. When notified of the death Pate came to Seattle from his home at Charleston. He was unable to explain his wife's action. Mrs. Pate was suffering from a nervous disorder and went to Dr. Frederick Bentley's office, accompanied by Mrs. Lucile Ritchie, a nurse, to have her eyes examined. They were awaiting consultation when Mrs. Pate, remarking the room was too warm, walked over, opened the window and climbed out.

**Pocket Slasher Gets \$823 Check**

Seattle police are making an effort Monday to locate the coat-slaashing thief, who stole a purse containing a check for \$823 and \$70 in cash, from Miss H. Gunhus' pocket Saturday.

Miss Gunhus, who lives at the Glenside hotel, told the police that the pocket book was in her pocket when she went into the First Hill pharmacy at Ninth ave. and Madison st., but that it had disappeared before she reached another pharmacy at Boren ave. and Madison st., several blocks distant.

The check was signed by O. H. Gunhus, her father, who lives at Everett.




