Will Take the Great N. W. to New York City

Pacific N. W. Tourist Association to Stage "See America First" Show

YAKIMA, Wash., Jan. 8.—Representatives of the commercial organizations of the state attending the meeting of the Washington State Chamber of Commerce in session here unanimously endorsed and pledged the support of the Pacific Northwest Tourist Association to a great "See America First" travel exposition to be held in the Grand Central palace, New York City, in the last week of April under the auspices of the Pacific Northwest Tourist association.

Only 10,000 square feet of exhibits is necessary to secure an exhibition limited exclusively to Washington, Oregon and British Columbia, and the convention went on record pledging its members to secure at least 5,000 feet of exhibits from the state of Washington.

The exhibition idea, which was enthusiastically received by the commercial organization representatives, was placed before the convention by Herbert Cuthbert, executive secretary of the Pacific Northwest Tourist Association, who made tentative arrangements for it during a recent trip thru the East in the interest of the association.

Presenting the exposition plan to the convention, Mr. Cuthbert said: "We have a splendid Pacific Northwest to New York; we will show the people of New York and of America the natural resources, the scenic beauties, the manufactured products and the opportunities for profitable investment of capital in this section."

There could be no other means devised by which the scenery, the natural wealth, the large industrial possibilities of the Pacific Northwest could be brought to the attention of the nation so spectacularly and in such a short space of time and by which financiers could get an adequate idea of the profitable value that can be made of money in the states of Washington and Oregon and the province of British Columbia as is furnished by this exposition.

It is planned to bring the New Englanders to Seattle and vicinity thru the Winchester Repeating Arms company, of New York City, the corporation to charter a special train of 17 Pullman coaches or a steamship for passage thru the Panama canal.

Latin America Won't Back U. S. in Mexico

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 8.—The United States is receiving neither sympathy nor support from Latin American countries in its dispute with Mexico, arising out of the arrest and imprisonment of William O. Jenkins, consular agent at Puebla.

Neither will any of the countries of Central and South America view in a friendly spirit any invasion of Mexico by this country as a result of the present controversy.

There are today no new influences pressing for intervention in Mexico. The affronts of today, the lack of protection to American property and life, are no worse than three, four and five years ago, when the administration firmly refused to adopt an active intervention policy.
