Confesses at Revival That He Slew Girl

STUBENVILLE, O., April 15.—Harry Miller, 26, Akron, O., was in custody here today while police were trying to verify his alleged confession to the murder of Frances South, 11, near Adena, Ohio, about a month ago.

Miller was arrested in a little church at Beach Bottom, W. Va., last night during a revival meeting. When the pastor, Rev. John Miller, called for sinners to come forward, Miller started down the aisle with arms outstretched.

"God have mercy on my soul, I killed the little girl at Adena," members of the congregation told the police he cried.

Apparently in the grip of religious fervor, Miller, according to witnesses, said he beat the child to death with a revolver because "she said mean things to me."

Miller was turned over to the police. They said he repeated his story and told of hiding the revolver in a hollow tree.

Crool Cops! They Ban Pajama Dance

PARIS, France, April 15.—No more pajama dances, either private or public, was the edict sent forth from the prefect of police. The pajama dance was inaugurated last summer by the "fat suit" of society as a strictly private affair, but the craze spread.
