Hearken, Ye Roly-Polys! As Others Grow Thin Her Purse Gets Big Here's Anti-Fat Crusader

ARE you too fat? Don't worry. It's a blessing. For in these days of the high cost of living the fat man and fat woman can kill two canaries with one stone. Poundage and living costs can be reduced at one and the same time. It is the fat of the hour. New York started it. Chicago followed. The parks back East are full of fat folks who've turned jumping-jacks to take off excess avoirdupois. And now the craze has hit Seattle. Madame Marshelle, a svelte young woman who maintains an obesity laboratory in the Yale building at Third ave. and Union st., and who once weighed 190 pounds herself, has a class of women who are losing their superfluous flesh at the rate of 8 to 10 pounds a week. CUTS WEIGHT AND COST OF LIVING They live, meanwhile, on the juice of oranges, cereals, and such. Thus, living costs are slashed to the utmost minimum. Soon, says Madame, there will be an anti-fat restaurant in Seattle—an institution sadly needed here. In her class of 25 to 30 women, Madame has some weighing 450, 350 and many over the 250 mark. Her "champion," a 400-pounder, was so fat she couldn't walk. She was too heavy on her feet. But, of late, she has been losing an average of eight pounds a week and is now able to walk to Madame's studio. One of the class wanted to reduce her weight to half. She weighed 200. "Must I even give up my home-brew?" she cried. "Yes," Madame told her. "I can't," she said. And went away. Another decided she couldn't give up her chocolates. A girl of 17 came in. She had been to a dance. "Can't you," she asked, "reduce my calf? Charley saw it, and said I was too fat." "But Madame could not, tho the girl begged tearfully. If one is to be reduced, one must be reduced all over. "You tell Charley," Madame advised kindly, "to mind his business." One of the patients came back the end of the second week and said: "Madame, I do not understand it. The first week I lost 12 pounds; but the second week not an ounce. I weigh the same today that I did seven days ago. And I have followed the rules unwaveringly." "Did you follow the prescribed exercises every day?" "Faithfully." "But you eat just what was prescribed; no more?" "Yes. But I was awful hungry, and I ate all that was on the bill of fare every meal." And she had. She had eaten combined breakfast, dinner and supper menus three times a day—for a week. Another wanted to take the course if she would be permitted to dine at a banquet two weeks hence. This was impossible. Two weeks later she returned. "Well, I went to the banquet," she declared. "I'm ready to be reduced. But I mustn't let husband know." It was really on husband's account that she was determined to grow thin. "I'll do my exercises in the bathroom," she told Madame. She did this two nights, after husband had gone to bed. On the third night, the falling of 200 pounds of flesh on the bathroom floor awakened husband from his slumbers. He thought it a burglar, and investigated. She confessed all, and said, determinedly, now that she'd been caught, she'd give reducing up. And the next morning husband appeared with her at Madame's place of business, squeezed her thru the door and demanded: "Now get busy." And today she weighs 115 pounds and plays tennis every afternoon. Grandmother came. She weighed close to 300—so close she was ashamed to get on the scales. She dieted and exercised. "And now," says Madame, "she looks like her granddaughter, and does things her granddaughter cannot do."
