## PALMER TRAMPLES ON CONSTITUTION, NOTED ATTORNEYS DECLARE

WASHINGTON, June 2.—Declaring Attorney General Palmer has trampled the constitution under foot, and has instituted czarism in America, the National Popular Government league made public here today a document that reveals unbelievable conditions charged against the attorney general.

The conditions pictured are backed by scores of affidavits from persons alleged to have been oppressed by Palmer, and they reveal cruelties to both men and women that are without pity.

### LAW SCHOOL DEANS SIGN THE DOCUMENT

The document is signed by 12 eminent lawyers, some of them heads of famous law schools. These lawyers investigated and made the report for the National Popular Government league. It is addressed to the American people.

Says the report: "For more than six months, we, the undersigned, professors whose sworn duty it is to uphold the constitution and laws of the United States, have seen with growing apprehension the continued violation of that constitution by the department of justice of the United States government."

The lawyers who signed the statement incriminating Palmer are: Roscoe Pound, dean of Harvard law school; Tyrrell Williams, St. Louis, dean of the law school of Washington University; Frank P. Walker, New York and Kansas City; Francis Fisher Kane, who recently resigned an United States district attorney; Swinburne Hale, Z. Chafee, Jr., Cambridge, Mass., professor of Harvard university law school; Prof. Ernst Freund, professor of jurisprudence and public law, University of Chicago, and author of "Standards of American Legislation"; Swinburne Hale, attorney and former captain in the military intelligence division, general staff, U. S. A.; Felix Frankfurter, Harvard law school, New York; Alfred Niles, Baltimore, late judge of the district court; Jackson H. Balston, Washington, D. C., member of American Bar association; David Waterstein, Philadelphia, member American Bar association, and R. G. Brown, Memphis, Tenn.

### CONTINUAL ILLEGAL ACTS ALLEGED

The report continues: "Under the guise of a campaign for the suppression of radical activities, the office of attorney general, acting by its local agents throughout the country, and giving express instructions from Washington, has committed continual illegal acts.

"Wholesale arrests, both of aliens and citizens, have been made without warrant or any process of law, men and women have been jailed and held incommunicado without the access of friends or counsel; homes have been entered without search warrants and property seized and removed; other property has been wantonly destroyed; workmen and women suspected of radical views have been shamefully abused and maltreated.

"Agents of the department of justice have been introduced into rail-

cal organizations for the purpose of informing upon their members or inciting them to activities; these agents have been instructed from Washington to arrange meetings upon certain dates for the wholesale raids and arrests.

### COUNTRY'S NAME IN DISREPUTE

"We are concerned solely with bringing to the attention of the American people the utterly illegal acts which have been committed by those charged with the highest duty of enforcing the law," says the document—"acts which have caused widespread suffering and unrest, have struck at the foundation of American free institutions, and have brought the name of our country into disrepute."

### Seems There Are Plenty of "Ghosts"

Since Wednesday night, when Detective C. C. Fortner broke up a seance at 631 W. 55th st., and arrested William W. Abner, the ghost, and R. D. Chase, his assistant, the police have been besieged with telephonic tips of seances being held nightly throughout the city. Abner and Chase are being held on open charges pending the filing of state charges against them. The wide publicity given their arrests have led to many "tips."
