

Inauguration Ceremonies Will Be Staged at Olympia on Wednesday

OLYMPIA, Jan. 11.—Who has been elected governor? And lieutenant governor? Officially the tale has not been told yet. It will be when the house and the senate convene in joint session at 2 o'clock this afternoon to canvass the returns of the November election. It will be then that the glad tidings will be given formally to Louis F. Hart, William J. Coyle and the other state officials.

Following this will come the inauguration ceremonies Wednesday afternoon. A special platform has been erected in the rotunda of the capitol for this occasion. After the inauguration the two houses will again convene jointly to hear the governor's message.

EVERYTHING RUNS ON SCHEDULE

Everything was so well oiled and greased in both houses that they were thru with their first day's business Monday in about one hour. For the first time in years there were no contests for the speakership or the senate presidency to be settled during the session.

There was no maneuvering for position, no parliamentary strategy or acrobatics.

The stage had been set, the parts had been rehearsed well, and the legislators were off to a good start.

William Short, president of the State Federation of Labor, commenting upon the committee appointments, calls attention to the fact that two farmer-labor men in the house have been placed on the committee on insane asylums and other state institutions, and neither is a member of the industrial insurance committee.

"Was it accident or design?" he asks, good naturedly.

Again is the query, "What's in a name?"

Representative E. Dollar, of Grays Harbor, surely sounds like ready money, but neither he nor P. Banker, of Okanogan, is a member of the committee on banks and banking.

Of course the appropriation bills to cover legislative expenses had to come first—and they did.

Next to them, the bill providing "blue sky" legislation has the distinction of being the first to be introduced. Senator Renick is its sponsor. Three hundred extra copies will be printed for general distribution.

Notes From Legislature

House members divided in their votes for speaker. Some voted "Aye" and the others for "Gule." Both won. The "ayes" were recorded with the rest of them for Gule.

Senator T. D. Rockwell was getting a little impatient at the routine of things in the senate and suggested an adjournment rather than take up the introduction of bills. President Pro Tem Taylor explained that the senate had to wait for the first two appropriation bills, covering the expenses of the legislature. These had been passed by the senate and sent to the house.

"I think we ought to go to eat," said Rockwell.

"I'm interested," replied Taylor, "in getting these bills attended to so that we may have something to eat with."

Taylor won.

The Adam family has been leading for a long time. And the house of representatives is no exception. The first name on the roll-call is W. H. Adams.

In nominating E. H. Gule, of Seattle, for speaker, Pliny Allen, who is close to and is a member of the powers that be, indicated an opposition to any return to the convention system. He spoke of old days when it was customary for counties outside of Seattle to unite against anything the big city wanted. "It lives in our minds only like the old convention, mere memories of the past," he said.

The first good chuckle enjoyed by the house was when Representative E. F. Hanter, the only democrat in the house, in seconding Gule's nomination, did it "on behalf of the entire democratic membership."

Charles M. Baldwin, of Garfield county, who also seconded Gule's nomination, served with Gule in the legislature of 1919. Gule was speaker of the house then also. The general

Jury Disagrees in McDonnell Trial

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 11.—Unable to agree on a verdict, the jury before which Allen McDonnell was tried on a charge of assaulting Jessie Montgomery was discharged by Superior Judge Ward shortly after midnight.

The jury stood 10 to two for acquittal on the final ballot. It was reported. The first ballot had nine to three for conviction, but in subsequent ballots the opinion of the jury had turned considerably, but not enough to bring a unanimous verdict.

Judge Ward said he would set a time for a second trial before the end of the week.

Is Found Guilty of Grand Larceny

G. E. Slade, automobile polish dealer, accused of misappropriating \$100 sent him by one W. H. Robertson to use in the defense of Clayton Dyer, who was then on trial on a statutory charge, was found guilty of grand larceny in Judge Walter M. French's court Monday. In prosecuting the case Deputy Prosecutor Bert C. Ross claimed Slade had said he used \$92 of the money to "fix" Deputy Prosecutor T. H. Patterson.

Detroit Automobile Factories Reopening

DETROIT, Mich., Jan. 11.—With two of the larger automobile factories and several of the smaller factories resuming production on a part-time basis, the gradual return of the largest industry in Detroit to normal is foreseen by those acquainted with the situation.

The Continental Motors corporation resumed work yesterday with several hundred men. The plant has been closed since December 21. The Studebaker corporation resumed work with 2,000 men.

Several smaller factories closed tight for several weeks have opened. It was unofficially reported that Dodge Brothers, closed for several weeks, will open shortly. The Ford Motor company, which employs close to 60,000 men, is expected to open shortly after February 1.
