### LUDENDORFF IS BEING WATCHED

Germans Suspect His Presence in Munich

BERLIN, Jan. 24.—Rumor has it that General von Ludendorff is being watched by the revolutionists in Bavaria. He is, however, too clever to let his hand appear openly in the situation there, just as he was too clever to be "caught with the goods" when the Kapp Putsch came, the day which was one of the earliest callers at the Kapp chancellery.

### HE HOPES TO BE GERMANY'S SAVIOR

Many Germans believe that Ludendorff is living for the day when he could be hailed as the "savior of Germany." But reasonable persons from both the conservative and radical camps credit him with too much sense to be actually leading an armed uprising which might only bring entire troops pouring into the Ruhr or an entente air fleet blasting German cities.

The whole situation in Bavaria and elsewhere does not, however, rest in the hands of Ludendorff or men of his caliber. There are many hot-heads and these will press, just as they did in the Kapp Putsch, "The Bavarian Revolution" has been touted very strongly of late, especially since the entente insisted upon dissolution of citizens' guards organizations there. There is plenty of material there for a coup, bent on re-establishing monarchy; there are weapons and well organized groups to do the "revoluting," should the signal be given.

### LUDENDORFF IS KEEPING QUIET

The situation is such that a prophecy would be dangerous. It can only be said that most of the advertised-in-advance revolutions don't happen in Germany—or, if they do, they don't last long. It is likely that if the reds are kept under control this winter, the Potsdam Putsch group will find little occasion to cut looks.

However, one thing is certain, Ludendorff isn't sitting in Munich to enjoy his famous works of art. He isn't in touch with a lot of reactionaries just simply because he needs society. And, he didn't move from Berlin to Munich just because Munich is a cheaper city in which to dwell.

LONDON.—(By Mail)—There is trouble in the camp of the Young Women's Christian Association here. Recently it has been advocated that, as the women are not only Christians, but young, they should be allowed to disport themselves after the manner of youth, and this has resulted in the innovation of dancing, card-playing, smoking and theatricals.

On this account many have seceded from membership declaring that these things are not compatible with the aim of the association.

This has not altered the policy of the authorities. At most Y. W. C. A. assembly rooms the dancing continues, as well as all other youthful pastimes as members care to indulge in.


### High-Speed Cable to Alaska Planned

### PLAYWRIGHT'S BROTHER DEAD

Brother of Paul Armstrong Paralysis Victim Here

Funeral of Capt. William Armstrong, former Great Lakes boatman and later mining man, who died here last Wednesday, will be held Tuesday at 2 p. m.

Capt. Armstrong was a brother of Paul Armstrong, the famous playwright, and of Rolf Armstrong, the artist, now in Paris.

Capt. Armstrong died at Columbus sanitarium, a victim of paralysis.

Besides the brothers, he leaves a widow, a son, Robert, of New York and a sister, Mrs. Strang, and his mother, both of Portland.

The widow was in the East, where she had gone to attend the son's wedding. A telegram apprising her of her husband's death reached her there. She and her son will not arrive here until the morning of the funeral.

### Canada to Honor Japanese Soldier

VANCOUVER, B. C., Jan. 24.—Canada will give Shigeji Nakata, heroic Japanese soldier in the great war, who died here today of tuberculosis, a military funeral.

Nakata was one of the brave band of 194 Japanese who enlisted with the Canadian forces that served in France. All but 12 were killed and Nakata is the first of the 12 to die.

Nakata, while fighting heroically at Ypres, was gassed, tuberculosis set in and he has since been an invalid.
