Atlantic Shipping Strike Threatens

NEW YORK, April 20.—With operators and employees apparently deadlocked on the question of a wage cut, the prospect of a great shipping strike May 1 loomed today. The American Steamship Owners' association announced that a wage reduction of 20 to 30 per cent will be put into effect on that date, when the present agreement expires. Various branches of the International Seaman's union already have officially informed the operators they will not accept the cut and have presented counter demands. Andrew Furuseth, president of the union, said the other organizations would take the same stand.

WASHINGTON, April 19.—A substitute for the sales tax was being sought today by congressional committees handling revenue-raising legislation. Etaw, president of the library board, made spirited replies to several bitter allegations against the institution's management.

PLEDGES AID TO SOUTH AMERICA

Harding Declares Friendship for Neighbors

CENTRAL PARK, New York, April 20.—The United States stands willing to fight, if necessary, to protect the newly young democracies of the Western hemisphere from oppression and tyranny, President Harding declared yesterday, pledging his determination to stand by the Monroe doctrine. But this doctrine was never intended selfishly, and in preserving it the United States has harbored no dream of exploitation, he added. Speaking on pan-Americanism at the unveiling of the statue of Simon Bolivar, South American liberator, in Central park, Harding repelled in strong words insinuations that the United States had used the Monroe doctrine as a cloak for exploitation on the Western hemisphere. On the contrary, he said, pan-Americanism means "sympathetic and generous Americanism."

All American republics should "teach shows," he added, to show that achievement does not mean anybody's destruction. "No selfishness impels, no greed is urging, no envy incites, no hatred is actuating," Harding declared. A short but meaty section of his comparatively brief address was devoted to the Monroe doctrine. "There have been times when the meaning of Monroeism was misunderstood by some, perverted by others, and made the subject of distorted propaganda by those who saw in it an obstacle to the realization of their own ambitions," Harding said. "Some have sought to make our adhesion to this doctrine a justification for prejudice against the United States. They have falsely charged that we sought to hold the nations of the Old World at arms' length in order that we might monopolize the privilege of exploitation for ourselves. Others have protested that the doctrine would never be enforced if it sought to involve us in actual hostilities."

Accidental Fall Kills Seattle Man

VANCOUVER, B. C., April 20.—Testimony of friends who witnessed the occurrence resulted in a verdict of accidental death by a coroner's jury that held inquest over the body of H. H. Stewart, secretary of the Carnation Milk Products Co., Seattle, who was killed by a fall in the home of Dr. A. P. McLennon here. Harry Stubbs, advertising manager of the Carnation company, and two Seattle lawyers who were present testified that Stewart opened the wrong door and fell to the basement. His skull was fractured.
