Henry Albers is to go free. Eugene V. Debs is still in prison.

Both were convicted under the espionage law. Debs has been in the penitentiary for some time. Albers has not been in prison a single day.

Both were charged with talking against the best interests of the United States in times of war.

But there the similarity of their cases ends.

Albers was pro-German. Debs was simply anti-war.

Debs was a conscientious objector, Albers was a kaiserite.

Albers could have sung for joy had the kaiser won the war. Debs could have done no such thing. Debs was as much an enemy of the kaiser and all he stood for as any man alive, but his mode of warfare did not jibe with the declared policy of this government.

The pro-kaiserite escapes punishment,

however, while Debs and hundreds like him are still paying the penalty of hating war more than loving their own country.

This is no brief for Debs. It is no brief for him or any of his followers who, when the stress of war demanded unity of action and teamwork from all Americans, failed to see the path of duty.

Yet the outstanding fact remains that German agents, convicted of conspiracy, are all free by this time, while only the so-called political prisoners are still in confinement. The spies and the would-be spies, and the real kaiser sympathizers, escape. The internment camps are empty. Only the pacifists remain in prison.

Debs bought no Liberty bonds. Neither would he buy German bonds. Albers, if one-half he said betrayed his real sentiment, would gladly have bought the kaiser's bonds if he could.

If Albers is permitted to go free, it is a mockery of justice to keep Debs or any pacifist in the toils of the law any longer.
