ALLEGED BANK BANDITS TAKEN

Three Captured Alive While One Is Killed

CORVALLIS, Ore., June 28.—The fourth bandit implicated in the attempt to rob the Halsey State bank, near here, yesterday, was captured early today and lodged in jail with two of his companions. One man is dead.

The newly captured man, R. W. Cooley, dropped from the speeding car before it entered Corvallis early yesterday, where his companions were apprehended. He took to the open country and worked his way around to Summit. He has a ranch near the town. Officers took him without resistance.

The explanation offered by the men, who have signed a full confession of their deed, is that they had been drinking moonshine. The car they used is declared to have been stolen, as were the firearms used by the youthful bandits, none of whom is over 24.

Henry Schultz, who was killed, received a full load of buckshot in his back, while his brother William, with William Wright, were both wounded slightly.
