CAMP LEWIS TO CONTINUE
 Many Cantonments to Be Abandoned

WASHINGTON, July 27.—Camp Lewis will be retained by the War department, it was announced yesterday by Secretary of War Weeks.

The Third division, now stationed at Camp Pike, will be moved to Lewis. Headquarters of the Eighth brigade at Lewis will be transferred to Vancouver barracks, Wash.

Camps which will be abandoned are Camp Devens, Mass.; Sherman, Ohio; Grant, Illinois; Pike, Arkansas; Meade, Maryland; Jackson, South Carolina; and Bragg, North Carolina.

Camp Dix, New Jersey; Travis, Texas; Lewis, Washington; and Knox, Kentucky, are the camps that will be kept up, according to the war department head.

The Fourth division at Camp Lewis is placed on the inactive list. Its command will be reduced to a brigade and transferred to Vancouver barracks.

PLANS FOR DISARMING CONFERENCE CALL FOR MANY CELEBRATED MEN

WASHINGTON, July 27.—The most distinguished gathering of world statesmen ever assembled on American soil will gather in Washington, probably early in November, for the conference to be called by President Harding to consider limitation of armaments.

In addition to representatives of the six powers directly included in the conference, special diplomatic observers will be there from as many more countries.

Already many suggestions are being heard in official quarters as to delegates.

For United States it is understood no person who had any connection with the peace negotiations at Versailles will have any major part in the Washington conference.

The representatives from each country are expected to number three or five—probably the former. Each mission will be accompanied by staffs of experts.

The United States delegation, it is stated in high quarters, will be bipartisan or, rather, non-partisan. However, two of three representatives, if that number is decided on, will be republicans, or at least three of five, if the larger number is chosen.

Secretary of State Hughes and Elihu Root, former secretary of state, are declared certain to be named on the American delegation. George Wickersham is mentioned as a possible third republican, but it is more probable, if three republicans are named, the third member will be Chairman Lodge of the senate foreign affairs committee. If Lodge is given a place, it is believed Senator Hitchcock, ranking democratic member of the committee, also will name and perhaps a second democrat in Charles R. Crane, former ambassador to China.

An examination of the field of likely representatives from the foreign nations discloses as possible members of the various missions: FOR GREAT BRITAIN: Premier Lloyd George, who has indicated his intention of attending; Viscount Bryce, Earl Grey, Viscount Milner and Rt. Hon. Arthur Balfour.

FOR FRANCE: Premier Briand, who has said he hopes to attend; Philip Berthelot, secretary general for foreign affairs; Louis Locheur, Stephen Pichon and Gabriel Hanotoux, with the possibility that Clemenceau or Viviani might be selected.

FOR JAPAN: Premier Hara, Minister of Foreign Affairs Uchida, Baron Makino, member of the diplomatic council; Viscount Chinda and Baron Shidehara, ambassador at Washington.

FOR ITALY: Marquis Della Torretta, minister of foreign affairs; Count Sforza, Baron Sonnino, Tomaso Tittoni and probably former Premier Nitti or Carlo Aliotti. The latter was selected recently for ambassador to the United States, but was switched to Japan. He was for years stationed at the Peking embassy and is an expert on Far Eastern matters.

FOR CHINA: Premier Chin, Minister of Foreign Affairs Yen and Alfred Sze, minister to the United States.

Representatives will be in Washington, altho perhaps not accorded membership in the conference, from at least Belgium and Holland. Belgium, thru her great interests in China, and Holland thru her island colonies in the Far East, are recognized as having a vital interest and will be permitted to make representations on the Far Eastern problem. Holland probably will speak thru H. A. Van Karnebeek, minister of foreign affairs, and Belgium thru Carton De Wwart, president of the council of ministers, and H. Jastar, minister of foreign affairs.

Administration authorities say the "one best bet" is that the sessions will convene on Armistice day. The place of meeting probably will be at Seattle.


