THINK MURDER PUZZLE SOLVED
New Killing and Arrest Provide Clues
EVERETT, Aug. 2.—Will the killing of John Levi Swigget and the arrest of James (Red) O'Brien at Mount Vernon last week clear up the mystery of the death of Lee Slater, Spokane taxi driver, on the night of July 14?
Officials in Mt. Vernon believe that it may, and also that direct clues to the robbery of Spokane gas stations have been found.
Slater was found on the morning of July 15, gagged and bound, in the Spokane river, after responding the night before to a taxi call from two men. His money was gone.
On the same night two gas stations were robbed by two men.
O'Brien, who is being held in Spokane, is said to have confessed to the robbery of the two stations. It is also stated that he has a mother, a Mrs. Webster, living in Seattle. O'Brien declares he has a sister whose husband is a Seattle barber.


