

ZEROLENE FOLK SHOW USE ON CHEVROLET



MODEL 490

ENGINE—23-X. Daily, or every 100 miles, pour into crankcase oil reservoir thru filler pipe sufficient fresh Zerolene No. 5 (former designation heavy) to fill reservoir to proper level. On Model 4-99 there are two oil try-cocks on left side of crankcase. Oil level should never be above the upper try-cock, and should not be allowed to get below the lower one. On Model 4-99 oil level gauge consists of a metal rod, which can be withdrawn from the left side of crankcase. Best results will be obtained if the oil level is maintained between "Full" and "Half Full."


