100 DEAD IN TEXAS FLOOD

Bodies of 47 Victims Are Recovered

TAYLOR, Tex., Sept. 12.—Bodies of 20 victims of Friday's and Saturday's storm and resultant floods have been recovered here today.

No one was willing to estimate how many more victims there were here. Reports from surrounding territory showed confusion, with damage running high and communication demoralized.

DALLAS, Tex., Sept. 12.—The dead in the flood terror of Central Texas will total more than 100, according to reports received here today from the stricken area.

Bodies of 47 victims of the floods of Friday and Saturday have been recovered at San Antonio. Relief work is now under way, and clearing of wreckage, under which more bodies may be found, has started.

Reports from Taylor stated 30 Mexicans had been drowned on the farm of J. M. Bowen, 10 miles from that city. Five were reported dead at Calvert and Bryan. Georgetown dispatches announced the death of two.

Wharton, where last reports stated the Colorado river was still rising, has one known dead, and several are missing.

It was impossible to place the exact estimate on property damaged. Indications, however, from meager reports are that it will run into millions, because of the loss in live stock and farm buildings. Fear was expressed today for the southern part of the state, thru which the mad waters that damaged Central Texas must pass.

into the brush. The noise ceased. The roads from the penitentiary to other portions of the island are being closely watched since Gardner is believed to be hiding within a few hundred yards of the prison buildings.

Although Warden Maloney and several of the searchers are convinced that the fugitive has not left the island, many of the island ranchers who have been working as extra guards and have been keeping close tabs on the manhunt, declare that Gardner would have been a fool not to have reached the mainland several days ago.

They expect that he will be captured hundreds of miles from here.

Another Letter From Gardner; It's a Fake

Postoffice Inspector J. S. Swenson has in his possession Monday another letter from "Roy Gardner."

Last week Swenson forwarded to Warden Maloney at McNeil Island penitentiary a missive purporting to have been mailed in Seattle by the escaped mail train bandit. Monday Maloney returned the letter, with another received by himself.

This letter, penciled on cheap paper, was mailed in Aberdeen Sept. 5, but is dated Sept. 10 by the writer, who tells the warden he is "feeling fine and has eaten a good meal."

Both letters, Swenson says, are fakes.

Accept British Invitation to Meet September 20

DUBLIN, Sept. 12.—Sinn Fein's reply to the British invitation to a conference at Inverness on September 20, was forwarded to Premier Lloyd George today, it was officially announced here. The note of the Dail Eirann accepting the British premier's invitation.

It was reliably reported here today that Sinn Fein's delegation to Inverness September 20 would be President Eamonn De Valera, Arthur Griffith, Herbert Barton, Prof. MacNeill and Erskine Childers.

The presence of De Valera at the head of the Sinn Fein plenipotentiaries will occasion surprise in view of the fact that he was authoritatively reported to have ceded his place to Griffith.

All interned Sinn Feiners may be released before the proposed conference between the British cabinet committee and Sinn Fein plenipotentiaries at Inverness, it was reported today.

MURDERS TWO TO GET AUTO

Two Suspects Held With One Who Confesses

CHICAGO, Sept. 12.—Search for accomplices of Harvey Church in the fiendish murder of Bernard J. Dougherty and Carl Ausmus, Packard Motor company salesman, netted two suspects today.

Church confessed to binding and then beating his two victims to death to obtain a \$5,400 Packard de luxe. Conflicting statements led police to believe he did not commit the crime unaided, as he first stated.

Dougherty's mangled body was found in the Des Plaines river. His wrists had been handcuffed. Ausmus' battered body was found buried face downward in Church's garage.

The confessed murderer said he killed the men because "someone had threatened to kill his father, mother and sister if he did not produce a touring car."

Police said he killed the salesman to obtain the car, in which he wanted to show off at Adams, Wis., his home town, where he was arrested.

Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Church, parents of the boy, are being held in a downtown hotel for further examination.
