

COAL PRICES IN BIG DROP HERE

State Product From \$7.80 to \$10.45 Per Ton

You can get Washington coal today for \$7.80 to \$10.45 per ton at the bunkers.

This is a drop of from \$1.66 to \$2.59 for Pierce and King county coal. The reduction was made by operators in keeping with their statement several weeks ago that the price of coal would come down when the mines opened up.

The briquet plant of the Pacific Coast Coal Co., at Renton, has resumed operation, and more than five carloads of briquets are being shipped into Seattle daily.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Sept. 15.—Eleanor Monroe, known on the stage and screen as "Daphne Dare," today was granted an annulment of her marriage to a man named Monroe, who, she said, she never saw before or after the marriage ceremony.

The marriage took place here three years ago after a "few drinks had been served," she told the court.

State Treasurer Reports on Cash

OLYMPIA, Sept. 15.—For the week ending September 9, the state treasurer showed a balance of \$10,382,193.22, according to the report of Clifford L. Babcock, state treasurer, to the state auditor.

Receipts totaled \$194,527.87 and warrants paid out amounted to \$1,270,944.95. Three funds showed overdrafts as follows: Capitol building construction, \$162,255.29; fisheries, \$484.26; Centralia normal school, \$314.42; total, \$164,953.97.

Balances in three funds were: General, \$2,381,196.59; permanent highways, \$1,954,526.77; veterans' compensation, \$1,782,757.77.

WILL PROTECT GIRL WORKERS

Condition in Hop Fields Are Probed

PORTLAND, Sept. 15.—Official chaperons for girls of 15 and 16, many of whom have been doing as they please in Oregon hop yards, will be recommended for next year, according to George Ehringer, chairman of the Portland child welfare commission.

The commission today completed a preliminary survey of special conditions in the hop fields. "Girls have their own tents and do exactly as they please," Ehringer said today. "They may stay out late to dance, receive whom they like and there is no one to gainay them."

Their parents assume that they are well-cared for. "The investigation of conditions among the younger workers in Oregon hop yards was precipitated yesterday when two children were found to have been maltreated by their parents."

The preliminary survey has revealed conditions of a highly objectionable and disheartening character, Ehringer said.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—President Harding and his party were on their way back to Washington today on the yacht Mayflower. When the president left West Point last night it was his intention to proceed directly to the capital, arriving there Sunday. There was a change, however, that he might put into Norfolk for another round of golf, which would delay his arrival in Washington until Monday morning.
