



HARDING MAY AID GARDNER

President Answers Appeal for Pardon

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 4.—Promise to call the attention of the attorney general to the case of Roy Gardner was made by President Harding in a letter received yesterday by George North of the editorial staff of the San Francisco Bulletin.

North had transmitted to the president Gardner's appeal for pardon from McNeil's island federal penitentiary, from which he escaped on Labor day as a climax to his sensational career as a mail robber and custody-breaker.

"The president directs me to acknowledge receipt of your telegram of September 23 concerning the case of Roy G. Gardner and to say that this matter will be taken up with the attorney general," read a letter North received. It was signed by George B. Christian, Jr., secretary to the president.

FIVE HELD IN LIQUOR RAID

Two Large Stills, With "the Makin's" Also Taken

Five men are held in the county jail Tuesday following a booze raid late Monday night by federal prohibition agents operating on the ranch of Peter Nicholson, one and one-half miles from Covington, near Kent.

The officers also seized two large liquor stills, one ton of corn mash, 600 pounds of corn meal, 100 sacks of rye, and a complete camping outfit.

Peter Nicholson, William Dolin, William Hyett, Unselmo Corrodini and D. J. Bruno are the names given by the men arrested.

Fifteen officers, led by State Prohibition Director Roy C. Lyle, parked their three autos a mile from the Nicholson farm and under cover of darkness walked to their destination. Thru heavy underbrush and across a miry swamp the trail led, finally coming out on the banks of a small stream which drained a miniature valley.

Here the two stills were found, alongside a tent in which Doken was sleeping. He was placed under arrest.

While one squad of officers was seizing the stills, a ton of corn mash and the camping equipment, another squad arrested Nicholson at his house.

One man was left at the house to guard the prisoner, and while he was waiting three Bruno drove up in an auto with 600 pounds of corn meal. He was arrested and the meal and car seized. In the hay in a barn, and Hyett, who occupied a nearby house, were taken into custody.

Under the hay were found concealed 100 sacks of rye.

Collection and transportation of the stills and other equipment occupied the greater part of the night, and the prisoners were brought to Seattle and lodged in the county jail Tuesday morning.
