3. "How Obedience is Obtained." An examination of practical methods.
4. "The Psychology of Punishment and Reward." Their effect upon conduct.
5. "The Causes of Certain Common Faults of Childhood." Slowness, forgetfulness, quarreling, untruthfulness, stubbornness.
6. "What to Avoid in the Discipline of Children." A consideration of the more usual faults of parents.

The last time I saw such, so far as I know, was in 1888 away down in Arkansas, 90 miles south of Fort Smith and 75 miles west of Hot Springs—those two places were the nearest points to market and a railroad.
