Famous Actress Leaves Movies for Vaudeville

In her dressing room at the Moore theatre, Monday, I had the pleasure of meeting Vera Gordon, star of "Humoresque" and "The Greatest Love," big film features. Miss Gordon was dressed in a pretty black gown of soft silk and wore a most becoming little flowered turban with a most becoming veil. She was just ready to leave the theatre, having finished her matinee performance.

So much has been said about Vera Gordon's ability to portray mother roles, I wanted to find out if she attributed her success in depicting this character to the fact that she is herself the mother of two lovely children. "I don't believe that an actress has to be a mother to interpret the role of a mother on the stage," said the star. "Acting is largely a matter of studying the part one is to play. For instance, I've played the part of a crook. And I swear to you I never was a crook in my life."

Miss Gordon journeyed all the way from Europe to the special request of Fannie Hurst to play the mother role in "Humoresque." The billboards did not feature her, but the public enthused so strongly over her wonderful acting that the real star, Alma Rubens, faded into oblivion. "I never made much money," said Miss Gordon. "I worked in 'Humoresque' at \$200 a week. Alma Rubens, the star, got a thousand. Gaston Glass, who played my son, made \$400. And I was advertised in time as the star. You know, the picture is in two periods—I am young in the first and the producers were afraid I couldn't play the part of an old woman in the last half. They wanted to get a double for me. They tried to find one. Finally the director, who had faith in me, threatened to throw up his \$2,500 a week job. I was permitted to go on."

The public now prefers "happy endings" in pictures and in stage productions, according to Miss Gordon. In her vaudeville act at the Moore this week, Miss Gordon is a widow who suddenly becomes rich from her husband's inventions. A young man and a girl, confidence people, try to fleece her. She discovers the young man to be her son. A detective shoots him. The son really ought to die, but, says Miss Gordon, "We tried it with him dying in New York, and afterwards the managers came around to me and asked me what we were trying to make of his theatre—a cemetery? So we had to change the ending. It hurts me, tho, to say, 'Oh, he will live.' What beautiful acting could be done if he didn't live! But—the public likes the happy ending. And it is the public we must please."
