

Senate Blocks Pay of 25,000 Veterans

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—Allotment checks to some 25,000 wounded ex-soldiers who are taking federal training and hospital treatment over the country will be held up, it was learned late yesterday, at the United States veterans' bureau. This is due to the senate's failure to act quickly enough on the deficiency bill giving the veterans' bureau \$40,000,000.

Million Asked for Veterans' Hospital

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—Senator Ashurst, Arizona, has introduced an amendment to the deficiency appropriation bill asking that \$1,000,000 be spent on a hospital in Arizona for the treatment of disabled war veterans. Ashurst said 50 gassed men are dying in Phoenix because of lack of proper medical attention.

GARDNER HANDS CASH TO CAPTOR

Insures Payment of Reward by Pleading Guilty

PHOENIX, Ariz., Dec. 12.—Roy Gardner yesterday afternoon unexpectedly entered a plea of guilty to the attempted robbery of a Santa Fe mail train at Phoenix.

He was sentenced to 25 years in Leavenworth federal prison. Gardner's trial for a previous mail robbery committed at Maricopa resulted in a hung jury, which was discharged Sunday.

The Phoenix robbery was the one which resulted in his capture at the hands of Herman Indlered, mail clerk.

Gardner's plea of guilty insures payment of government rewards to Indlered, who disarmed and captured the "bandit of bandits" in a desperate hand-to-hand struggle. Gardner was sentenced by Judge William H. Sawtelle immediately after entering his plea. He received the sentence calmly. Dolly Gardner, his wife, who has been with him throughout his previous trial here, was at his side when the verdict was passed. She went quietly.

The bandit will be taken to Leavenworth tonight, the United States marshal's office announced. He will go under special guard. He will not be tried again on the Maricopa charge, it was announced.

Offer Cash Prizes for 2 Editorials




