

Watch These Detours If You Go a-Motoring

Autolists taking advantage of the present good motoring weather will find five principal detours necessary in King county, according to County Engineer Thomas R. Beeman.

Having on Bothell highway necessitates a detour on the North Trunk road. Go east over the Ballinger road from Echo lake to Lake Forest park. This adds about 4.6 miles to the journey. This road is expected to be open September 15.

From Kenydale to Bellevue the road is closed for paving, which when done will complete the 84-mile boulevard encircling Lake Washington. Detour from Kenydale

over the old road east to within a mile and a half of Bellevue. By October 31, according to the contract, the road from Newport to Bellevue will be open.

Due to the Tolt bridge being out, the Snoqualmie river cannot be crossed at that point. To get to Tolt, go to Woodinville or Duval, and up the river to Tolt, or go to Mill City and down the river. The bridge should be completed August 1.

A short detour is necessary to

get from Renton to Earlington, where the state is paving the main road. Go up the hill past the old mine at Renton. The main road will be open in two months.

The Orilla-Kent road will be closed in four to six weeks, and it will be necessary to detour over the east side valley paved road.

The connecting road between Pacific highway and the west side valley road is closed, but there are other roads a mile north or south.

These are the principal detours listed at the present time. Other small side-journeys may be found off the main traveled roads, but an easy way around will be found in most cases.

Library Circulation Shows Big Increase

A large increase in the circulation of books and a decrease in the funds available for maintenance are shown in a report just issued by the Seattle public library.

In 1921 2,097,858 books were loaned for home reading and the library's reading rooms were often inadequate to care for readers within the building. Business depression caused a slump in tax receipts and the library was forced to operate with a smaller staff and with less money for new books. This condition will continue thru 1922 because of the cut of \$25,000 in the library's appropriation.

Two Seattle hospitals were provided with regular library service during the year. Each hospital is visited once a week by a librarian who takes a carefully selected lot of books.

City firemen and steamship officers are two other classes who cannot come to the library, so the library goes to them. Deposits of books are maintained in 23 fire sta-

tions and in the Admiral Line Officers' club.

The municipal reference division co-operated with the Seattle building code commission by compiling summaries of the building codes of other cities. The city engineering department, the civil service commission and the public utilities department were also heavy users of the library.

Total receipts from the city were \$286,887.65, of which \$212,068.98 was spent for salaries and \$45,918.31 for books, periodicals and binding. Eight hundred and ninety-seven different magazines and 182 newspapers were received during the year.

Since 1916, the number of books loaned for home use has increased 225 per cent, while the library's appropriation has been increased 120 per cent. The American Library association recommends \$1 per capita as the minimum appropriation for good library service. The amount available in Seattle for 1922 is only 83 cents per capita.

FUND FOR VETS IS NOW \$14,000

Convention Plans Pushed In \$25,000 Drive

Building owners Monday pledged an additional \$1,000 to the \$25,000 fund being raised to finance the Veterans of Foreign Wars' national convention and reunion of the 51st Division association, according to S. B. Asia, chairman of the citizens' committee in charge of the drive. At the close of business Monday night, approximately \$14,000 of the \$25,000 had been pledged, Asia said.

The passenger department of the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway Monday began preparations for a nationwide distribution of posters and circulars advertising the veterans' convalescence to be held here in August. These posters will be sent to all ticket offices and depots of all the trunk lines for display.

Delegates from foreign lands and insular possessions will include representatives from China, Belgium and at least one delegate from the army of occupation on the Rhine, in addition to the regularly elected delegates from the Philippine islands, Porto Rico and the Isthmian Canal zone.

An illuminated marine parade, to be staged Saturday night, August 19, will be a prominent feature of the convention.

It is planned to have the Seattle Yacht club take charge of aquatic sports and racing events, and final arrangements will be made when Commodore James Griffith returns from New York, in about ten days, according to Daniel L. Pratt, who represented the yacht club at a meeting of the program committee Monday evening.
