In 1852 Mary Low married W. B. Sinclair, with whom she made her home in Seattle for many years.

Two sons, Alvin E. and Clarence W. Sinclair, and a daughter, Mabel H. Sinclair, survive her.

No funeral arrangements have been made as yet.




